Dear Friends,

There is always a slightly different experience of Easter, in the life of the church, when it falls particularly early in the cycle. As I write this message, it is still mid-March and we are already nearing the tail-end of our Lenten program, ironing out final details for our Easter services, and staring down the rapid approach of Holy Week. While April 1 isn't quite as early as some we've seen in past years (I distinctly remember the March 23 timing, in 2008, which is the earliest any of us will ever experience it), these earlier arrivals of Easter still manage to create something of an 'Already?' sensibility to them. Both in church leadership, and in the general scope of life, we can find things a little disjointed and out of place when March Madness is still in full swing, the weather hasn't truly broken, and we are coming to the resurrection before the lilies even begin to awaken from their winter slumber. Things can feel just a bit more unusual, or even surprising, in these early Easters. But, what I've found, at least for me, is that there is something beautifully appropriate about that very sense of surprise!

There is a shocking and awe-inspiring nature of the resurrection that I think has been lost, in some ways, over the years. In the nearly 2,000 years of history we have seen since the resurrection, it has become a celebrated and majestically remembered event in the church, and in the lives of those who profess the Christian faith. However, the majestic celebration, seen again and again year after year, has erased some of the jaw-dropping nature of the miracle. So, what I suggest is that it is not all bad that, even if just a little, Easter catches us a bit off-guard now and then.

When I consider the thoughts that must have gone through the minds of the women who heard it proclaimed that 'He is risen,' or the emotions of Peter and 'the one whom Jesus loved' as they arrived at the tomb and found nothing but

Jesus' clothes, or the utter surprise Mary must have known when she stood face to face with the Risen Lord and heard him call her name, I am deeply compelled by the shocking, awe-inspiring and mind-blowing nature of the resurrection. And, when I consider that nature of the resurrection, I consider how truly ill-prepared Jesus' followers would have been at that moment. So, with all of the ritualistic pomp-and-circumstance that goes with the annual celebration of the miracle of Easter, perhaps it's not all bad to know just glimpse of how truly unconventional, irregular, unprecedented, unexpected and sudden an event it was to discover that our Lord is risen. Perhaps just a little of that surprise can help us to recognize what a glorious and unprecedented love it was that was shown to us in Christ.







The History of Our Organ

In 1985, the need to replace the church's failing electronic organ was recognized. In November, 1988, a six member Organ Study Committee was constituted. In addition, this committee had 2 consultants with knowledge of organ design and one consultant with architectural expertise. Two other Organ Committees worked on the project between 1988 and 1993. These later two committees had six members and also two consultants with knowledge of organ design, a financial consultant, an architectural consultant and a local non-church member with expertise in acoustical design and organ construction. Many members and friends of the church contributed greatly of time, knowledge and resources to make this organ truly a treasure -- an object of beauty to play, to see and to hear. Glory Be to God!



The organ was designed, voiced and built specifically for our church sanctuary by J. C. Taylor Organ builder of Kaukauna, Wisconsin. The versatility of the organ lends itself to congregational hymn singing, and for accompanying the choir, soloists, and instrumentalists. The organ was ready for dedication at the 10 AM worship service on January 31, 1993.

The organ blends with the existing style and architectural elements of the sanctuary. The central window with the stained glass panels when open and the shuttered window with the cross was maintained. The organ is moveable and when faced the great organ pipes are located on the left and the pipes for the swell organ are located on the right, with the pedal pipes divided between the two sections. The console is crafted of ash and the key bay is of black walnut. The standard keys are covered with ivory and the sharps keys are of ebony. Whenever the organist is present and when the organ is open, please stop and take a look at its beauty and might--and ask questions


