

#### **Christmas Worship Schedule**





#### PREVENTING SEASONAL FLU WITH VACCINATION



The FLU or INFLUENZA is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses that infect the nose, throat, and sometimes the lungs. It can cause mild to severe illness and at times can lead to death.

Are you ready for the flu season? We are all busy but it is very important for us to get our Influenza vaccinations either from our doctor's office or any commercial pharmacy that provides the vaccinations.

Vaccinations should be administered ideally by the end of October but it is better to receive a vaccination than to acquire the illness and pass it on to others. In 2016, the peak months for the flu activity was December to March.

Vaccinations are available for those 6 months of age and older. Children to age 8 will require two vaccinations four weeks apart, in order to develop antibodies. It takes two weeks for the antibodies to develop and begin to protect the spread of disease to the community.

Influenza vaccinations are not to be given to those allergic to eggs, egg proteins or known allergic reactions to previous influenza vaccinations. You should consult your physician regarding the type of vaccine you receive and any precautions needed for chronic illness.

#### Signs and Symptoms

- Fever
- Cough
- Sore Throat
- Runny or stuffy Nose
- Muscle or Body aches
- Headaches
- Fatigue
- Some people might have vomiting and diarrhea

**Contagious period** - People have the greatest contagious period the first 3-4 days after the illness begins. However, children and those with weakened immune system might infect others for a longer period.

Complications of the Flu can include Bacterial Pneumonia, ear or sinus infection and worsening of chronic medical conditions such as congestive heart failure, asthma or diabetes.



It is very important for each of us to obtain our FLU injections – SOON!

### A PIECE OF HISTORY

#### THE NORTH SHORE CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH CRECHE

My parents Dr. Val and Charlotte Lang were founding members of North Shore Congregational Church in 1949. I remember going to early services and classes at Country Day School on Santa Monica Blvd. just south of School Road, the dividing line between Whitefish Bay and Fox Point. We lived on Berkeley Blvd. and in early days before the building boom we could see the school from our house. I also attended Kindergarten there and it was a comfort to my mother to be able to see the school.

My older sister Frances' wedding was the first wedding in the new sanctuary on August 20, 1955 and the first funeral, August 7, 1957, was my father's. There was no air conditioning in those days and I remember both events as being almost unbearably hot. My father was a well loved physician and the crowds turned out. The reception seemed to go on forever.

Two years later my mother took my younger sister Suzanne and me to Europe. One of the highlights was visiting Oberammergau, Germany and touring the theatre where the famous Passion Play is staged every ten years. While there my mother decided to order a crèche set in memory of Dad. She wanted something larger than a table model but not too huge. Finally the size and type were decided on and the order placed with the crèche to be delivered to North Shore Congregational Church in Fox Point before Christmas. The wording on the plaque was later determined after we got home.

Mother remained in Milwaukee until my younger sister left for college out west. Then, being widowed and her children gone, she decided the Wisconsin winters were too harsh for her arthritic joints. After I and my younger sister were married at North Shore, she made Arizona her home, with the exception of returning to our Port Washington cottage a few summers. She lived in Carefree, AZ until her death in June of 1989.



I returned to Port Washington early 1991 and stopped in to see the crèche. I was saddened to see that two of the sheep had broken legs and asked if I could find someone to fix them. I found a craftsman in the industrial area of South Milwaukee who accomplished the task and the sheep were returned intact to the manager setting.

Without any of my family in the area and attending North Shore, for many years people thought another Lang family had given the crèche but that was not the case. It is a joy to know the crèche my mother contributed in loving memory of my father is still displayed at Christmas time for all to enjoy!


