Dear Friends,

While January has been a surprisingly quiet month in regard to weather, it seems that every year we come across icy and snowy conditions that end up reminding me of the same phenomenon—namely, the 4x4 driver who clearly believes he/she is impervious to the perils of winter roads. You all know the person I am talking about. It's the woman who is doing 70mph on the snow-covered lane of the interstate while everyone else is doing 45 on the lane that has been cleared. It's the man zipping back and forth from one slick lane to the next as he weaves his way through the slower traffic. And yes, it's the person we see spun out and down the ditch on the side of the exit ramp because he simply didn't slow down enough to make the turn.

It can be a scary thing to watch, at times—and we've all seen it. Every time snow falls on the roads of Wisconsin, we see one driver after the next who has come to the clear determination that their 4x4 vehicle means that the pitfalls of snow and ice (and physics!) simply don't apply to them. Suddenly, it would seem, the fact that they have engaged all four of their wheels means they no longer need to worry about keeping safe distances, driving reasonable speeds, taking corners and curves cautiously, leaving room to stop, or any of a hundred other things we do in order to be safe on winter roads. Then, not surprisingly, we see these same 4x4 vehicles littered in the snow banks as one after the next learns, the hard way, that having one important tool for the road doesn't mean we can ignore the need for all of the others!

That, I would suggest, is a reminder we all could afford to hear now and then.

Ask yourself a few questions. First, try to come up with an estimate of how many people you know who attend worship on a regular basis (consider, perhaps, how many of your own family and friends attend worship consistently). Then, ask yourself how many of those people take time for prayer outside of worship? How many of them read the Bible

regularly? How many attend Bible studies, engage in meditation, or otherwise seek to discern with Word and Spirit of God in their lives? How many of them actively serve the needs of others or engage in the missions of the church? Consider how many people attend worship on a regular basis, but then consider what a small portion of that pool actually engages in the other 'tools' and practices of Christian living and spirituality.

The truth is that when it comes to faith we all tend, at least at times, to be a little like that over-confident 4x4 driver plowing across those snow-covered roads. Many of us embrace that one tool of faith (we attend worship), and then we march forth confidently into the challenges and pitfalls of life as though the fact that we utilize that one tool means we don't need any of the others. Then, suddenly, we hit one of life's slick spots and realize find ourselves wishing we'd made a little wider use of the tools at our disposal.

There are, however, other drivers out there on those same snowy roads. They are the drivers who have the four-wheel-drive vehicle and can, therefore, take on those snowy roads with confidence. They also know, however, that their 4x4 system only works if it is accompanied by their caution, their attention, their discipline, and all of the other practices that allow them to get safely home in the midst of the storms. They are the drivers that see the importance of not just the one tool, but all of the tools it takes to make it through the storm! All I am suggesting is that, as Christians, perhaps we could take a lesson from those drivers, embrace every tool at our disposal, and thus be able to forge ever more confidently through the storms that life will bring upon us.


Mark your calendar for our annual Ash Wednesday service.


Knit together by God!

MINISTRY OF THE MONTH CENTERING PRAYER

The first time I stumbled into the Centering Prayer Group, I knew my idea of prayer was going to be challenged. I really didn't want to go to a prayer group, because I was afraid I would be embarrassed or exposed somehow....I was looking for another sort of group, but couldn't find something that seemed to be what I was looking for.... When I arrived and saw there was only one other person there, my fears quickly started grabbing me by the throat, as though to pull me out of the room. The person who was there was Todd Davison. He welcomed me graciously, patiently explained to me what the group did, and then invited me to stay if I wished.



I did stay and I kept returning week after week. Outside of the meetings, I was reading books about the contemplative practices of early Christians and about the movement in the 20th century to revive an understanding of these practices. Centering Prayer is an outcome of this renewed interest. There are Centering Prayer groups in churches of all denominations of Christianity. It is wonderful to have the opportunity in our church to explore this way of deepening our relationship with God.

Having spent the first 50 years of my life adhering to the way of prayer I learned in Sunday School and that my mother taught me, all of which is good, I have been surprised by how my relationship to God has changed simply through taking time to be quiet and be open to God.

All are invited to join us every week between the Sunday services for a time of reflection on the scripture readings for the worship service that day. After a time of quiet, we talk and listen to each other. We welcome everyone! This is an open group where we seek to support each other's journey as followers of Christ.

All items MUST BE NEW.



Are Your Affairs in Order?

Looking ahead! Wellness! Yes, a state we all strive to achieve—physical, mental and spiritual wellbeing. Guidelines for better physical health are well known: balanced diet, adequate healthy liquid intake and rest to name a few. But, we are more than systems of hearts, lungs and kidneys as many advertisements seem to suggest. Our brains, emotions and spiritual being also need attention in order to have a happy, fulfilling, life. This part may not be as easy as using printed guidelines for physical well-being. It may require time, prayer, serious thinking and acting to alter individual circumstances.



But, how does this occur? We are all individual persons who have grown up in a complex maze of social and environmental factors that influence how we think and act. This is true for 10 year olds, 20 through 60 years and beyond. Some of us have already achieved a state of comfortable mental and spiritual being. Others may be struggling with outside issues that cloud physical well-being. Still others may be seeking different ways of thinking and acting to move forward. There are ways to make happiness, hope, joy and peace a part of daily practice.

This article is to let you know of several forthcoming opportunities here at North Shore Congregational Church that may be of interest to you. Under the leadership of Rev. Julie, the Health Committee is working to bring these opportunities here this spring.

Are Your Affairs in Order is a 3 week series on Sunday's after the 10am worship service. February 26, March 5 and March 12. A light lunch will be hosted by Stephen Ministry for participants, the class will run from 11:30-12:45. This course offers resources covering practical matters, writing legacy wills and funeral planning plus several attachments helpful for End of Life planning.

About Guest Speaker Rev. Barbara Jordan: After 30 years in the corporate world, Rev. Jordan finally responded to God's call and entered the ministry. Following seminary, she relocated from the warm beaches of northeast Florida to Mequon and served as pastor of congregational care at Crossroads Presbyterian Church. Five years ago, God lead Barb to hospice chaplaincy at Zilber Family Hospice in Wauwatosa.
