

Dear Friends,

As most of you know, we have been going through a period of transition and discernment, throughout the 2016-2017 program year, in regard to the manner in which we provide staff to lead and coordinate ministries for the children and youth of our church. After a series of reflections and reconsiderations over the course of that time, I am excited to share a couple of updates on our progress in this endeavor.

First, I am thrilled to announce that our own Leslie Krueger (who has been our Children's Choir Director for many years, and has served as our Interim Director of Children's Ministries over the course of this past year) will be staying on, permanently, as the Director of Children's Ministries. Leslie has done a wonderful job with the kids over the course of the year, and has grown to love the work that she is doing. Over the past few months, we have held a number of conversations of how the position might work for both Leslie and the church, on a long-term basis, and the new position was formalized this past week. I am truly excited to know that Leslie is staying on board, and I look forward to what she will bring to those ministries in the future.

Throughout this journey of reflection and consideration for our Children's Ministry staff, we have also spent great time considering how we might provide staff for our youth ministries in the years ahead. We have made great strides, throughout 2016-2017, in gaining traction in ministries and programs for the youth of our church, and we are looking to how we might best capitalize on that foundation moving forward. With this in mind, we are also happy to share that the restructuring of Leslie's position within the church has freed up the funds we need to launch a search for a Director of Youth Ministries (yes – BOTH positions will be able to be supported within the budgeted amount that was originally slated for the position Leslie has been filling this year).

Exciting New Beginnings cont...

The position we have designed for the Director of Youth Ministries will compliment (and coordinate with) Leslie's role in many ways, but will focus on the opportunities for ministry to young people in grades 6-12. With an anticipated workload of approximately 6-8 hours per week, the Director of Youth Ministries is expected to lead Sunday morning opportunities, as well as weeknight/weekend gatherings. The key now, of course, is to find that person!

If you know of someone who might be right for this work, or you would be interested in exploring it yourself, please contact me and I can share more. In the meantime, please join me in welcoming Leslie aboard in her permanent position in the church, and embrace this next search process in your prayers as we look to build on what God is doing in the life of our church. It has been a wonderful year for the children and youth of our church, and I truly can't wait to see what comes next!


Thursday Morning Bible Study


Relax with friends and neighbors with "Music on the Lawn," **Wednesday evening, June 14,** from

Potential new members are encouraged to participate too.




Take me out to the ballgame!

WCA LEADERSHIP SUMMIT

North Shore Congregational Church hosted this year's Wisconsin Congregational Association Annual Meeting on Friday and Saturday, April 28-29. The format was slightly different from recent years in that it included the usual business of the Association, as well as a Leadership Summit.

Pastor Tim Roberts, from Stuart Congregational Church in Stuart, Florida, was the keynote speaker for the Leadership Summit. The focus of the weekend was about "The Adaptive Church" – an exploration of how things are changing and the need to recognize that "Church" may be more than just a Sunday morning event. Pastor Tim's opening talk focused on the history of the Church, Christendom and the changing context of the church – a good foundation for the weekend's exploration of moving beyond the traditional practices of Sunday worship.

This was followed by a panel discussion on "20 Somethings: Where are they?" Three young women, who currently work with WCA Youth and Camp, shared their thoughts and answered questions from the audience about their faith and where the faith connection happens in their lives. In most cases, the Sunday morning church experience rarely happens unless they are home worshipping with family. However, they shared that their connection with God is present and their faith is strong – they do not have to be in church to believe and feel God's presence in their lives. The panel session gave us much to consider about being in relationship with individuals of this age group.

Saturday morning began with the Business Meeting – including reports from current officers and committees, approval of the 2017-2018 budget, and presentation &



acceptance of the Slate of Officers for the coming year. Julie Sheridan Smith shared information about pulpit exchanges that have happened this year and how it has helped to strengthen connections between some of the Congregational churches. Cindy Bacon-Hammer reminded us of the Leadership & Lay Ministry Program and encouraged that anyone interested should contact her for more information. Mike Robertson shared information on the Minister's Fellowship Group and the presentations and discussions they share. It was voted that the day's offering be given to the Wakefield Fund in support of youth camp scholarships.

The remainder of the day provided several listening opportunities led by Pastor Tim Roberts, followed by break-out sessions for small group discussion. How do we "Bless and Add" to our traditional ways of worship? What opportunities do we have to think outside the box and be more inclusive to those who wish a faith experience beyond the traditional Sunday morning service? With permission, Pastor Tim's talks were recorded, providing us with an opportunity to share with those unable to attend the Summit. I look forward to continuing the conversation within our congregation in the year ahead.

Late afternoon provided a 'lightning round' of presentations on mission projects that member churches have supported this year. The Annual Meeting/Summit closed with Worship and Communion. It was a blessing to host the event, particularly in the year when our own Rev. Julie Sheridan Smith takes on the role of WAC Moderator. Special thanks goes out to all those who helped with food preparation and general hosting responsibilities before and during the weekend.


CONFIRMATION CLASS UPDATE
