Dear Friends,

On November 11, 1620, after more than 2 months of trials at sea, the Pilgrims made landfall on the eastern edge of Massachusetts, near Cape Cod, in a place we know today as Plymouth. Being far north of the region they had been assigned by the King (Virginia), special dispensation (known as a 'patent') was needed for them to remain in their new home. While they awaited that patent, however, there needed to be some sort of governance and structure for the people. With this in mind, the 41 adult males aboard the Mayflower developed and wrote what is known, today, as the Mayflower Compact – the very first document delineating the principles of self-governance in the New World, and a document that would stand as the active cornerstone of the Plymouth Colony for more than 70 years (at which time it became a part of the Massachusetts Bay Colony).

The principles of self-governance and democracy, which were outlined in this document and stand at the root of so much of our national identity, are also at the very heart of our faithful tradition. The Congregational Way is one grounded in the very principles that date back to the Mayflower Compact of nearly 400 years ago. In the Congregational Way, we are not governed by denominational authorities, ecclesiastical hierarchies, or other groups and/or persons who wrest control over the life of the local church. In the Congregational Way, we are free from such external controls in order to allow our selfgovernance to be the pathway through which the spirit of Christ can be revealed. The only authority that governs our church is Christ, our proper head, whose will is meant to be revealed through the discernment of the people in their faithful self-governance.

I remind us all of this foundational element of our way because, shortly after you read this article, we will gather for the pivotal event our self-governance as a church – our Annual Meeting. Another meeting in a life full of obligations can, at times, feel burdensome. But, this is the privilege and responsibility that is ours as members of a Congregational Church. The ministries we pursue, the decision we make, the challenges we face and the opportunities we embrace – these are not things that managed or dealt with by our staff, our denomination or our hierarchy – these are things that we confront together, that we take on together, that we embrace together as a self-governed body, gathered in a shared covenant, and guided by the spirit of Christ, who is the rightful head of our Church.

I deeply encourage each and every one of you to make it a priority to join us for our meeting on May 6. I'm the first to admit that it may not be as enticing as a day at the beach, or as entertaining as an afternoon at Miller Park, but it is at the very core of who and what we are as a church, and it is one of the greatest joys and responsibilities that we know in the Congregational Way of being a Church.




The Tuesday Morning Book Group meets

Congregationalism and the Church Merger of 1957



Various social, religious, and merger issues have influenced the development of Congregationalism in America. After the establishment of the Plymouth Massachusetts church in 1620 other European immigrant Protestant denominations, such as the Baptists, Lutherans, and Presbyterians, formed their churches based on their views of organization and often differing views about religious practices and doctrine.

Then the Civil War added new issues for consideration. Slavery and the movement of some churches toward abolitionist thinking as well as differences over the establishment of seminaries and the role of educational institutions as well as the role of evangelism caused division. Following World War I brought a movement of ecumenism forward and with it issues such as greater freedom in thinking about personal and sexual matters.

In 1931, The Congregational Church was a member of a merged group known as the General Council of Congregational and Christian Churches. In 1942, aggressive action by a group which was not a member of the General Council began causing concern. This group, the Evangelical and Reformed Church, was a liberal German entity with strong views on church organization and strong views about religious doctrine and practice. They started action for a merger with the General Council. At North Shore Church this group caused concern for some members who left the church to join the (then) Mayflower Congregational Church on Brown Deer Road. Definite action on this merger was delayed by the General Council until 1957 and when the vote was called about 70% of national and local members participated in the voting. Of this voting body 90 % affirmed the move to merge. The merged body was to be called The United Church of Christ.

The minority who had voted not join the merger included the North Shore Congregational Church. This minority group formed two organizations. The largest body is the National Association of Congregational Christian Churches (NACCC) whose headquarter is in Oak Creek, Wisconsin. North Shore Congregational Church is a member of this body. A very small group formed the Conservative Congregational Church (CCC). Just a note --some of the members who left to join the Mayflower Congregational Church returned to membership at North Shore.



Parents/Youth: Let us know if there is a special event, games, musical, play etc. that you are involved in so the church can cheer you on! Message Rev. Julie with dates and events.




FELLOWSHIP OUTING
