Dear Friends,

We’ve had wonderful opportunities, lately, to encounter many ways that people serve God through the ministries of this church. We’ve celebrated and commissioned our music and educational ministries during our Commissioning Sunday on October 11, we’ve highlighted the need to expand our pool of helpers in our children’s programs (to great avail) on some recent Sundays, and there are even a few notes in this Newsletter about others who serve in the ministries of this church in remarkable ways (see the note of thanks to Connie Mullins on p.3 and those pertaining to the concluding tenure of our Treasurer, Bill Ford, on p.8). It’s been a true joy to really look at how many people make a difference in and through the ministries of our church, and to reflect on what a true ‘ministry of all believers’ our fellowship is. With all of that said, however, I want to take this opportunity to encourage you to consider how YOU might be a part of that picture, for our church, in 2018 and beyond.

Throughout October (beginning October 8), our Stewardship Board will be guiding us through the 2018 stewardship campaign (you may have already seen some little pieces of paper they have ‘slipped’ into our orders of worship on Sunday mornings). As always, much of the conversation and dialog of this campaign will have a financial overtone. The importance of our completion of our Estimate of Giving cards for 2018, and the impact our fiscal contributions can have on the ministries of this church, are undeniable. While our minds so quickly turn to these important financial questions, however, I want to encourage you to be aware of the ‘other’ question our Stewardship Board is asking us. As much as our annual drive focuses on our EOG contributions for the coming year, the simple truth is that equally as important is the question not only of what we will give of our finances, but what we will give of ourselves!

A Different Kind of EOG cont...

While there is no question that it is our financial stewardship that keeps the lights on, pays the salaries, fixes the pipes, purchases the supplies, etc... it is our contribution of ourselves (our talents, our wisdom, our time, etc...) that foster the true ministry of the church. We may not be able to properly 'operate' without the finances that we contribute, but we will never truly minister to and serve one another, or the community and world around us, without the gift of ourselves that follows! In the past weeks we have had a number of opportunities to celebrate the manner in which people have been, and are, giving of themselves to the ministries of this church, and we have had the chance to highlight a few places in which we could use more people to step in and further grow the ministries of our church. So, in the midst of the fiscal overtones that so quickly permeate our annual stewardship conversations, I encourage you to follow your EOG with another, equally important question...

"Now that I have decided what of my financial resources I intend to commit to God through the ministries of our church, what of myself will I choose to commit as well?"

Milwaukee Hot Club plays "gypsy jazz," the music of the late great Django Reinhardt and his modern descendants. Their music is a high energy mix of swing, bossa, and gypsy samba rhythms. Gypsy swing arose in the late 1930's when Reinhardt, a genius protege Gypsy guitarist living in Paris, heard and began playing American swing music, filtered through his own experience and cultural identity.

HELP WANTED—TREASURER

Our **Treasurer** is one of six special people called “officers” (Moderator, Moderator-Elect, Clerk, Treasurer, Auditor, and House Chair). Officers are chosen, in part, to do their work “in between” the formal meetings of the membership as well as “in between” regular meetings of the Board, Committees, and Council. The officers each do much of their work “alone” and have substantial discretion as to what they do and how they do it. The officers each have a one-year term.

The Bylaws of the church state the Treasurer:

- I. Is a voting member of the Board of Trustees • Is an ex-officio member of Church Council, without vote • Is responsible for handling all income and expenses, as designated by the Trustees
- II. Assists the Boards and Committees in preparing their annual operating budgets, and assists the Trustees and Benevolence Boards in developing any extraordinary budgets (i.e., for capital, emergency, or long-term purposes)
- III. Prepares the formal summary of our financial condition at the close of the fiscal year, augmented by quarterly updates during the year, for review by the members. • Prepares the annual Operating Budget and other items for consideration by Church Council and the church membership
- IV. Is authorized to appoint assistant treasurers

The job requirements can be expanded with a bit more detail to include:

- a. Monitor the overall flow of income and expenses
- b. Coordinate and prepare the financial statements for the church presented at the end of each calendar quarter (during April, July, October, and January) as well as the end of each fiscal year
- c. Coordinate the creation of the annual church budget, which includes several steps: - Solicit participants from the Boards to serve as the ad hoc Budget Committee (during October) - Review the draft Budget with Church Council (Oct 17) - Present the draft Budget to the membership in a formal Congregational Meeting (expected Oct 22) - Present the final version of the Budget to the membership in a formal Congregational Meeting (expected Dec 17)
- d. Meet with the Board of Trustees (as a resource, but not as a voting member), monthly, on the first Tuesday evening
- e. Meet with the Church Council, monthly, on the third Tuesday evening

Our Treasurer is expected to interact with many other members of our leadership team, but has minimal requirements to attend regularly scheduled meetings. That can be a benefit for a member that is willing, but has a full schedule of other appointments.

Bill Ford has remarked that the flexibility of the position is one of the aspects that permitted him to serve multiple years, with a growing family. Our Treasurer has frequent interactions with our church office staff. This may be something that can increasingly be done “electronically,” although our recent Treasurers would frequently stop by the office personally.

One important annual function of the Treasurer is to chair the committee that prepares the annual church budget. This activity occurs (given our recent changes to our annual schedules) in late winter / early spring. It would be delightful if a prospective Treasurer (to be elected at our Annual Meeting in May) had the opportunity before then to observe the budget process led by our current Treasurer, rather than encounter it “cold” at a later time.

This is a truly unique position in our lay leadership. There is no question it is “important.” No prior accounting training is required, although that might be an advantage. Recent Treasurers are Bill Ford, Annalise Gossett, Bob Mullins, Reise Behling, Marina Rosenberg) – some with prior accounting experience, and some with none. Familiarity with computerized functions is a major advantage. Please consider your potential involvement as a lay participant in our church leadership, and contact a member of the Nominating Committee if you have any possible interest in serving as our next NSCC Treasurer.

HEALTH MINISTRY

Changing Seasons and Your Health

Fall is here, bringing its beauty, cooler weather, and - yes, those nasty allergies or a cold. Allergies in general are on the rise and the seasonal types seem to be lasting

longer. Sometimes it's not clear if symptoms are true allergies or due to another cause, especially in adults. Common symptoms such as itchy eyes, ears and throat are classic for allergies but are not present with a cold or flu, for example.

As windows close for the season, indoor dust and pet dander are likely to add to allergic discomforts. Cold and flu viruses are able to survive longer and be transmitted more easily in the presence of lower temperatures and dry air in the fall and colder months. Irritation of the respiratory system from allergies increases susceptibility to these viruses. Even if you are not an allergy sufferer, the likelihood of getting a cold

or other respiratory illness occurs as we tend to spend more time indoors with others when it's colder outside.

Some ways to decrease getting sick with the change of seasons are: treat your allergies as recommended by your doctor; try not to mingle closely with others who have a cold or respiratory illness; use frequent handwashing; stay hydrated; exercise daily; be sure to get your flu shot.

A Note from Rev. Julie

I wish to inform the church that I will not be continuing a Doctor of Ministry at this time. While I am disappointed, after much prayer and discernment I am clear this is the right decision in terms of good stewardship of my financial resources and time. I do appreciate the prayers and encouragement that so many of you offered.

A PIECE OF HISTORY

Recently, Jeanne Gaenslen and I spent time together talking about the early days of North Shore Church. Her stories brought vibrantly alive the church, its ministers, its members and children. Several stories follow.

When worship services were held at the Country Day School, the Sunday School children met in rooms adjacent to the gymnasium where the adults worshiped. Jeanne recalled that "Spike Parks and I were Sunday School Co-Superintendents."

After the church moved into its new building on Santa Monica Blvd, the Sunday School used meeting space in the present-day Fellowship Hall. A corner of that basement area contained a small office for Rev. Flynn.

Often the living room of the Gaenslen home in Whitefish Bay was the gathering place for cookouts and hymn singing for a small group, including Rev. Flynn and Rev. Fitzgerald (the second minister for the church) and several church members.

Both Rev. Flynn and Rev. Fitzgerald were young, outgoing, humorous Irishmen who had beautiful voices. They frequently sang duets during worship service.

For the church's ground-breaking ceremony, adult members brought shovels to the service and sang hymns during the ceremony. The Sunday School children participated by -placing memorial items in the cornerstone. Jeanne's children placed Bibles there.

Fred and Jeanne had several small children. When Barbara was baptized, her service was the first televised baptism to be shown in the Milwaukee area. (At that time, the use of television in churches was being explored).

Space prevents more personalized stories. If interested in learning more I am sure Jeanne would be happy to provide additional insights.
