Dear Friends,

It’s all working out just the way we had hoped!

As some of you may recall, we made a small (but important) change, last fall, by having our ‘board year’ begin a month earlier than it had in the past. Instead of outgoing board members retiring on June 30 and new boards taking effect on July 1, we advanced everything a month so that new boards would begin on June 1. The goal was simple – get the ball rolling and things in place BEFORE everyone gets into summer mode, allowing us to better operate over the course of the summer and plan ahead for fall. And, I’m pleased to say that it is working out just the way we had hoped!

CHURCH HISTORY CORNER

Planning and building the new church was marked by thoughtful determination, and no doubt prayerful consideration. Beginning in March 1949 members of Grand Avenue Congregational Church (then located on Wisconsin Avenue in Milwaukee) and Plymouth Congregational Church (located in Shorewood) met together to begin planning. On April 27, 1949 twenty-five individuals met together in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Frederick von Grossmann to pledge their support. After kneeling one by one, they signed the following statement: "For the glory of God, for the service of our fellowman, and for the mutual assistance of a Christian life, we the undersigned agree to become Founding Members."

By May 15, the church had a name, Fox Point Congregational Church, and a constitution. Soon after it became known as North Shore Congregational Church. The first worship service was held in the Country Day School (now the Karl Marx Jewish Community Center on North Santa Monica Blvd). This service was conducted by Dr. Everett McNair, Senior Pastor of the Plymouth Congregational Church. The second service was conducted by Dr. Jess Norenberg, Superintendent of the Wisconsin Congregational Conference. Thus, North Shore Congregational Church started with a strong foundation in Congregationalism.

During the first year, the Reverend Vernon I. Flynn was called to be the minister. He was 29 years old and came from New Jersey with a strong record of building church membership. A graduate of Naperville Illinois Theological Seminary with additional study at Union Theological Seminary and Columbia University (NYC), he was well prepared to lead the young church. He was ordained on November 6, 1949.

On November 6, 1949, three hundred twenty-nine persons also were received as Charter Members. Current living members of that group include: Helen L. Pfeifer and Sara N. Stover. By December 1950 the total adult membership was 480.

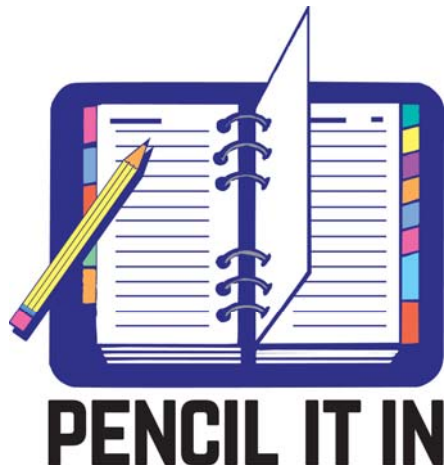

Facts and Myth's on Aging

While you might have believed it when you were 21, on the contrary, there is MUCH learning, growing, changing and adapting to do in our middle years and beyond--if we are so fortunate! If only a Life "Geek Squad" were available on the date of our births at the hospital, as at Best Buy, and our parents would have checked the "Extended Warranty" box, we would be set! Or would we?

We all know that there never has been, nor ever will be, such a thing as a life with zero physical, spiritual, or emotional bumps in the road. Yet, just as we all have different challenges, we all have different strengths that can help us add life to our years.

So what does "healthy aging" look like? - ❖ *“Journeying Through Grief”* - this helpful booklet series is mailed to a family member who has recently lost a loved one.
- ❖ *Mailing of weekly sermons* and orders of worship go out to homebound and home away members.

SAVE THE DATE! Sunday, **September 10** at 10:00am we start a **brand new year** with a brand new curriculum!



Continuing in the same fashion as last year, all families, children, and teachers will begin worship together. During this time we will commission all teachers and learners. Following the commissioning, the children and adult leaders will be invited to go to Sunday school and dive into a great new and engaging curriculum that brings those big Bible stories to life! Children in grade K3 through 5 will begin Sunday school together in one big room to hear the story of the week from a Large Group Leader (Grades 6-7 will meet in the youth room upstairs). A Bible story will be introduced each week using skits, experiments, videos, singing and praying. The children will then break into small groups to connect and dig deeper with age-specific apply-it-to-life activities, crafts and games. These groups will be led by Small Group Leaders for about 15 minutes.
