Dear Friends,

By the time you read this note, I will already be back from the Annual Meeting and Conference of the National Association of Congregational Christian Churches (NACCC). As I write it, however, I am looking towards that meeting in the coming weeks and thinking about the reminder it serves, for all of us, of the importance of the relationships we hold with sister churches in our region, our state, and across the country.

Any time I discuss the various forms of church 'polity' (structure) that we know in 21st century churches, I always make a significant distinction between the autonomy of Congregational churches and the independence with which it is sometimes mistaken. One of the great tenets of our approach to church governance is that each church is autonomous. We are free from the control of ecclesiastical hierarchies and empowered to dwell with the Spirit as we discern the will of God for our church. We do not need to subscribe to the dictates of denominational controls and are unconstrained in our efforts to submit to the headship of Christ in the church. These are core elements of what it means to be Congregational and central pieces of what I most value about our tradition.

At the same time, however, there is a distinction between these ideals of autonomy and the pure independency with which it is often confused. We are autonomous, we are free to follow the headship of Christ and the leading of the Spirit, but we are NOT ALONE! We are, intentionally, part of a fellowship of churches that is here to support us, and who we support in ministry and faith. From local clergy fellowships and state youth camps to national gatherings and worldwide missions, we come together to allow God's work to be amplified through our fellowship and shared ministries. are free, as an autonomous local church, to follow the headship of Christ and the leading of the Spirit in the life of our church. But, we are not alone. As I head to our annual conference in the coming weeks, I find myself especially grateful for the role of our church in those fellowships.

I see it as a true privilege to serve a church that has long stood as a leader in supporting the Congregational associations of which we are a part.


- We have past and current members who serve active roles in associations.
- We have past and current members who have been (and are) on the staff of the NACCC.
- Rev. Julie just finished her term as Moderator of the Wisconsin Congregational Association and continues her work on camp and lay ministry programs.
- I have the honor of serving as a member of the Board of Directors for the NACCC.

And, in addition to all of this, our church has been consistently ready and willing to share our leadership resources with our sister churches. Rev. Julie and I have both had the joy of leading worship in sister churches during times of particular need over the past couple of years. Rev. Julie will do so again on July 15 at our sister church in Franklin, and I will have the opportunity to preach the Consecration Sunday sermon at our sister church in Mukwanago this fall.

The fellowship of which we are a part is what makes Congregationalism special – it is what distinguishes us from the isolated independency with which we are often confused (and towards which we sometimes, inadvertently, stray). I am grateful to serve a church so historically and currently invested in these associations, but I use this opportunity to encourage all of you to learn a little bit more about the same. Take a look at our state and national associations to see what they are about. Talk to me, Rev. Julie, Rick Ruenzel (who is our delegate to the conference this year), Norm Christensen (who was our delegate last year), Rick Bauzenberger (who serves a number of roles for the NACCC), Debby Fulton (who is on the staff of the NACCC), or anyone else who has some experience with our wider fellowship. We are autonomous, we are free to follow the headship of Christ and the leading of the Spirit, but we are NOT ALONE! I encourage you to take some time to learn a little bit more about what that means, and to reflect on how our church might grow in its historic leadership and support of the associations of which we are a part.
