

Dear Friends,




## Lydia Circle January 28, 2019


We'll meet in Friendship Lounge at 10am to view the 2008 DVD "Flow."

In South Africa, villagers drink from stagnant ponds, unable to pay for the water that once was free, and protesters in Bolivia—where waste from a slaughterhouse is dumped into Lake Titicaca—brave gunfire to demand unrestricted access to potable water."

This promises to be a thought provoking, discussion generating opportunity.

In order that we prevent this in the future, I would appreciate it if you would follow the instructions below when making such a donation:

To make a contribution to North Shore Church by stock, do the following:

❖ Email (KerrinWhite@Northshorecongl.org) or send written notice to Kerrin White at the church office to give her notice of your intentions. Please state the date, name and number of shares you will be donating. Then, have your stock broker transfer the shares of stock you wish to donate to:

Account for North Shore Congregational Church at Robert W. Baird Inc. Our broker at Baird is: Scott Sullivan – (414) 765-3570

Please call me for account and routing numbers.

- They will notify me when the stock has been received by them and the sale will take effect as soon as possible. Please note that Baird has a fee and this fee will be collected from your donation, after which the balance will be paid to the Church.
- We currently have 2 donations made via accounts at Morgan Stanley which I am unable to match to a donating member. The first was made on November 1, and the second on or about December 12. If you think either of these donations were made by you, please contact me at 414-352-6123 and let me have the name and number of shares in question.
- ♦ I have also been notified that as of 2018, any withdrawal from a retirement account which has not cleared the bank by December 31, will not be allowed for that year. In other words, please make sure that such withdrawals are made early in December by the latest, so that they can be processed in a timely manner.


Meet at church 4 pm and back to church by 6:15 (after Kopps). If you are an adult who can come along as driver/helper, please let me know.
