As those who were with us in the late service on Christmas Eve will know, I was once again drawn, this year, to truly consider the Christmas story through eyes of those who were there. It is a Scriptural exercise in which I engage with some regularity, but each time I do so with the Christmas story, I am amazed at the strikingly unique manner in which each person would have encountered this birth.

- In Mary we find a woman who was compelled to set aside every plan and expectation she had for life, in order to submit to God's call.
- In Zechariah and Elizabeth we find a blessed and faithful couple with a deep and profound longing. In this story, they found hope hope that their prayers would be answered and their dreams fulfilled.
- The will of God that was revealed to Joseph was one that not only required him to set aside his own feelings, but to follow a call that went against the standards and expectations of his family, his community and his faith.
- This birth was the ultimate threat to Herod undermining his authority, his power and his very identity as King.
- For the shepherds, the shock of this story came in the fact that it was pronounced directly to them. The common shepherd was given the privilege of being among the first to stand at the side of the Christ-child.
- For the visitors from the east (or the Wise Men as they are often called), the encounter with this story meant that the very road the traveled would be changed.
- And, the angels? The angels were given the profound joy of delivering the Good News to so many whose lives would be changed by it.

## Experiencing the Birth continued...

So many different experiences of the story...so many distinct encounters with the Christ-child...and still, only one child! That, for me, was the stand-out reminder that I heard this year. This may be one story, but it was a distinct experience for each and every person who was there. The same is true for us. This may be the story we know so well - these may be the Scriptures that we have heard again and again for decades - but if we truly allow ourselves to engage the birth of the Christ-child, we will find that it is a wholly new experience that we've never known before.

Do you need to be challenged to set aside your plans and follow God, as was Mary? Do you need hope amidst your longings like Zechariah and Elizabeth? Do you need to be reminded to set aside your own expectations for power and control? Do you need to experience the joy of sharing the Good News with someone who needs it? That is the miracle of Christmas! This may be one child and one story, but this birth can meet whatever need you most know this year. I implore you, open yourself to the experience of Christmas - to the birth of the Christ-child! Because, if you do that, I am convinced there is a whole new encounter in store for you.






#### **EDUCATION AND FORMATION OPPORTUNITIES**



#### Another new opportunity! "Seekers" Bible study

The centering prayer group will host a 6-week seekers Bible study for all interested church members on **Sundays at 9am beginning on January 26, 2020**.

The study will be led by Tom Chelimsky. All sessions will be open to anyone whether you have attended prior sessions or not. We will study the book of Ephesians because it tells us a lot about prayer. Each session will open with a few minutes of centering and silence while someone reads a few key verses from the chapter. An open reading of the whole chapter together will follow, comparing the New Revised Standard Version with the Message. We will do our best to be sensitive to the Holy Spirit's leading in asking questions that develop new light and understanding. We will finish with more fellowship and discussion. Some may choose to seek further answers to the questions raised during the week (by looking at other verses, writings or resources) and report their findings to the group at the next session. This is strictly voluntary, neither expected nor required.

#### Winter Farmers Market and Brunch – January 26 from 11-1:30 pm

Local farmers, vendors and exhibitors, a delicious brunch, and fellowship with your church family...what could be better?

Mark January 26 on your calendars for our Food, Faith & Farming Network Winter Farmers Market and Brunch. Building on the wonderful success of hosting the Fox Point Farmer's Market the last few years, we are excited to bring back the Winter Market this January! The event is co-sponsored by Food, Faith & Farming Network, an ecumenical organization that works to foster urban and rural relationships and promote earth stewardship, community, spirituality and economic justice through healthy food and sustainable farming practices. Food will be sourced from local farmers.

A goodwill donation will be accepted, for the brunch, to support the work of Food, Faith & Farming Network, helping farmers across the state. Purchases from vendors not only supports their livelihood, but also supports the Harvest of Hope Fund, a nonprofit providing emergency financial assistance for farmers. Vendors donate 10% of their sales if they make a minimum threshold of sales to the fund. Since the Harvest of Hope fund was initiated in 1986, it has given away over \$1 million dollars to farmers in need.


# January 19, 2020 North Shore Congregational Church Celebrates

It is God's presence with us, it is what we appreciate so much when others are present with us. God works through presence. Being present with ourselves makes it possible to be authentically present with others.


Join us on Friday evening, February 7, through Saturday afternoon, February 8, at ChristPond just north of Random Lake off Highway 57.




Our long-awaited picture directory is now available. Thank you to Melissa Block for spearheading this giant project!
