Covid Fatigue

For those who are active on various social media platforms, I suspect that you, like I, have had more than a few laughs at the various 2020 based memes that are circulating. From Covid-19 to 'murder hornets,' 2020 has been a year of one unprecedented event after another – and social media has made the most of it. One of my favorites is the picture shown here that includes the caption, "If 2020 were an ice cream truck..."



Another one I've enjoyed simply reads, "I'm staying up until midnight at New Years! Not to ring in 2021. but to make sure that 2020 leaves!" There are a slew of these out there, and if you ever need a good chuckle, Google 'funny memes about 2020' and you'll find a plethora. What I find telling beneath all of the needed comic relief, however, is our shared psychological state that is reflected in that very humor.

The phrase "Covid Fatigue" is something that has become more prevalent as we have inched further into fall. With case counts growing higher, days getting shorter, and weather getting colder, the coping tactics that many have used in recent months are increasingly problematic — and all the while, we are torn apart by a divisive election, facing holidays without traditional gatherings, and staring down a long, cold, winter of isolation. And you know what? We're tired of it! The result of that fatigue, then, is that, like the meme expressing our longing to make sure 2020 leaves, we are driven ever further into a wholehearted focus on getting this all behind us. The challenge, however, is to remember that which can help us to carry that burden even as we wait.

Covid Fatigue continued...

The good news is that this will all, at some point, be behind us. While the specific timing is yet unknown (and the opinions, as always, vary greatly), there does seem to be a general scientific consensus that, as much as 2020 has felt like a slow and constant descent further into the pandemic, 2021 will bring that slow but hope-filled climb out towards the other side. It won't happen quickly, and there is no getting around that the next 8 weeks will be among the hardest we've known all year, but we will get there. Of that I am confident.

While we await that turn, however, and endure that slow climb to the other side, it is Jesus' word in Matthew that have been ringing in my mind. "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens," Jesus says, "and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." (Matthew 11: 28-30)

I want to encourage you...to implore you...to hold those words close to your heart in the weeks that are ahead. Claim the wonder of that invitation that Jesus extends, and bring your fatigue to him. We are weary! We are carrying heavy burdens! I have strong confidence that the vast majority of those who read this message fully understand what 'Covid fatigue' is meant to imply. What we also understand, however, is that we get to bring that weariness...that fatigue...those burdens...to the one nestles up beside us, thrusts his yoke upon our shoulders, and walks alongside as we carry that burden together.

Some of us are feeling it today. Many more will be drawn down by the weight of it all in the challenging weeks that are to come. I encourage you...I implore you... when that happens, claim the invitation that Jesus has extended. Let go of your willfulness and determination, and cling to the yoke that Jesus offers. Allow Jesus to be, for you, what he longs to be – and what you so desperately need him to be.

The bad news is that we are still far from beyond all of this, and that the months ahead could be as difficult as any. The good news is that there is very real hope that the climb towards the other side closer by the day. The great news is that, even as we wait, we can cling to the yoke of Jesus as we reminded that we never have to carry our burdens alone!


ADULT FORMATION

BENEVOLENCE

ONE SEASON OF GIVING

We will have only one special holiday offering this year that will benefit our longtime friends at St. Ben's Meal Program. As far as we can determine, NSCC has been involved for as many as 45 of the 50 years the program has been in place!

St. Ben's mission of serving the hungry, the homeless and the poor has been carried out all of these years by a variety of religious and civic groups, all of whom committed to prepare and serve meals on a regular basis. Six nights a week sponsors, volunteers, staff and guests gathered to share a meal in a safe and friendly community. With the onset of Covid, St. Ben's could no longer serve donated food and everything came to an abrupt stop.

Understanding the vulnerability of the population they serve, St. Ben's had to quickly shift gears to a new model of taking care of those in need. Since March they have closed down the Community Meal Program and begun preparing and distributing 100 meals a day to three different apartment communities serving the homeless, addicted and mentally challenged, as well as the Cathedral Center, a shelter for abused and homeless women and families. Now, instead of donated food and volunteer help, they rely solely on paid staff, food from local purveyors and food banks, and monetary donations. While this shift has been amazingly successful for those in need, it has come with a high price – significant increase in expenses and costs to St. Ben's.

As we considered recipients for this year's special holiday offering, we looked to the ongoing heroic efforts of St Ben's, our long standing relationship with them and the enormous number of people in our community today who are suffering from food insecurity - it was easy to choose them as the beneficiary of our offering.

We pray that you will give thoughtful consideration to sharing your blessings and give at least as much as you have done in the past for this special year-end offering. Where

possible, please consider giving more to support God's work for those most in need.

Thank you for your loving support of this important mission.


AgapeShere for Young Adults
