We hear the question again and again, 'When will things in the church get back to normal?' The truth is that it is not an easy question to answer. Some of you may recall my reflections, in last month's newsletter, about the manner in which we are attempting to be intentional and discerning in the balance of what beloved elements of our pre-Covid church life will return as they were, along with what new endeavors and lessons will be a part of that which comes next. The truth is that we will get 'back to normal' in some ways, while in others the old 'normal' will likely never return in the way it once was. This is an exciting opportunity for the church, but one that also, admittedly, leaves more than a few unknowns for the months and years ahead.

At the same time, while we aren't entirely sure how much of the old 'normal' will be a part of what comes next, we are also entirely aware that none of this has been, or will be, akin to flipping a switch to return our practices to that which once were. The arduous climb out of our Covid realities has been a slow turning of the mitigatory dial, and there is little doubt that there will still be some stages and evolution in the months ahead.

With all of that said, however, there is a date towards which we want to point in the life of the church. After 18 months of Covid separation, followed by various levels of mitigation, followed by a summer distracted by a return to so many beloved opportunities that pulled our energies elsewhere, we are truly excited to be setting our sights on **Homecoming Sunday on September 12, 2021**. After 18 months of being apart for so many reasons, this date is the closest we will have to a date in which 'normal' will return!

A Date to Remember continued...

What will that look like? We don't yet know! The next few weeks will bring meetings and discussions which will offer clarity about expected mitigation strategies, what the worship schedule will be, and more. At the same time, we are in active dialog with the members of our choirs, youth leadership, and others, about the form and function of those programs and ministries headed into this fall. More details on all of these things will come in future worship orders, announcements, and of course the September newsletter.

What we can tell you, however, is that things will begin to take on new forms, once again, on September 12. Our fall worship schedule will begin, our choirs will start to more regularly make their way back into our worship life, our weekly Sunday school offerings and regular youth events will restart, and our morning worship experience will be capped off with a Homecoming picnic for the entire church to celebrate the day.

There is still a lot we don't know about what is in store for the fall, and we expect to be able to share much more detail on these things in the coming weeks. For now, however, we pray that you will set aside the morning of September 12 to join us on the day on which we take the next big step towards whatever God has in store, next, for our church.



FALL CHOIRS SET TO RE-START






Families with Middle School - High School youth: We were excited to hear from
