"The 16 hours in the terminal went rather quickly when we made ourselves available to others." He writes. "We were not trapped. We were in the right place at the right time to reflect the love of God."

Earlier this week, I shared a reflection out of the Upper Room devotional series at the outset of our weekly staff meeting. The devotion was from an individual who was reflecting on a winter's night in which a storm had trapped


them in an airport terminal. Caught in an unknown city after a missed layover, this individual frantically called

their Minister wanting to pray. "We're trapped." The

gentleman said. Their Minister quickly confirmed that they were warm, dry, safe, healthy, and had access to food

as needed. With all of those necessities confirmed, the Minister quickly changed the premise of the conversation.

"You're not trapped," he said, "but I will pray that you

required at school, the clear text came from one of our kids, "Feels like such a setback!"

As we emerge from the ebullience of the Christmas season, and descend into the dark and blustery days of January and February – all while Covid seems to be, once again, moving in the wrong direction – I think it can be easy for us to feel a bit trapped in what can appear to be an endless cycle of frustration. It's at those particular moments of heightened frustration, however, that I think that Pastor's wisdom rings true. No matter how frustrating the moment may seem, there is an opportunity to reflect the love of God in the lives of others who are feeling it to – and that change of perspective can alter the entire experience for them, and for us.

So, as we enter into these cold and wintery months (with the pandemic not being nearly as cooperative as most of us expected it to be!), I will seek to keep that perspective in mind, and I encourage you to do the same. It's easy to feel a bit trapped, right now. But, perhaps by shifting our thoughts to the question of how we can reflect the love of God to others in the midst of our shared moment of frustration, we too might be able to look back upon these days not as a gauntlet we endured, but a blessing we shared!




