My reflections in our last newsletter (just a few weeks ago) were titled 'What Happens Now?' As the news was just emerging that Julie had been invited to candidate for the Sr. Minister position at our sister church in Wauwatosa, that article was a portion of our wider effort to answer some of the key questions that we knew would be emerging as we approach this next chapter of ministries here at NSCC. It has been (and continues to be) our goal to be as open and transparent as we can be throughout this period of transition, hoping that we are all as aware as possible of the steps being taken and the decisions being made. If you have questions (especially after reading this message), that message from the last newsletter, and our worship service from July 31, would be good places to start.

The one downside to all of our previous communications, of course, was that a lot of the lingering questions were met with the same answer, 'We don't know!' In numerous questions, particularly those dealing with more long-range plans, that remains the case (and will for a while). In many areas surrounding the more immediate transitional considerations, however, there are a number of updates that can be shared. So, in an effort to continue in that effort of transparency and awareness, I want to shift from last month's question of "What happens now?" to the question of "What's happening now?"

With Julie's call to FCC Wauwatosa formally confirmed by vote of their congregation on August 21, our sights are increasingly turning in the direction of actions that will help us move through the transition to come. Elsewhere in this newsletter, you will see information about opportunities to celebrate Julie's rich and meaningful ministry here at NSCC, as we send her on to the new call that God has in store for her. In addition to the fellowship events that are planned, we will have the blessing of listening to Julie's final sermon at NSCC on September 18,

and will take the opportunity to bring closure to her ministry here, while seeking God's blessing on her new call, during our worship service on September 25. There are many things in store to give thanks to Julie, and God, for the gift she has been to our church.

Looking beyond that date, I'm happy to be able to say that a lot of faith, thought and creativity has gone into making plans for the uninterrupted continuation of the many ministries and programs of our church. I do not want to take the time to get into the minutia of it all in this note, but I do want to highlight some major elements of what is happening in the coming weeks and months.

- Searches are underway for staffed leadership for our children's programs our youth ministries, and a team is meeting in early September to make plans for how to cover these responsibilities until such staff support is hired.
- A rotation of guest preachers is being lined up to cover worship leadership 1x per month, helping to alleviate some of the extra preaching load that is created in Julie's absence.
- Lay leaders have stepped up to lead the Tuesday book group, and a few creative options (both lay led and otherwise) are being explored for the Thursday Bible Study.
- A new approach to confirmation is being explored that will allow for a meaningful experience for our confirmands, while simultaneously providing essential flexibility for both their busy families and me throughout the coming year.
- Planning is underway (for proposal to the Deacons at their September meeting) for the development of a structured visitation ministry that will equip and organize members to get out and be in touch with our members who are unable to consistently be with us in worship and fellowship. This was already a need in the life of our church, and we are excited that this new chapter of our ministries will help to bring about even greater engagement with this portion of our membership.
- A group of lay readers has been formed and will meet in the coming weeks to bring meaningful support to our Wednesday and Sunday worship services.
- Teams for special projects (e.g. Advent Tea, Advent Devotional) are already meeting to make plans for this year's offerings.

There are many other elements and considerations, and various responsibilities are being passed along to boards, volunteers and staff as fitting. What is important to note, however, is that the 'Ministries to be Paused' list is nearly non-existent, and our church leaders have found those creative and faithful ways to carry on nearly all of our existing ministries (as well as the new ones just getting started) without interruption. There will be more to come in the weeks ahead, offering opportunities for each of our members to be a part of these many initiatives. For today, however, I hope you will join me in praying for Julie and Tom as they embark on their new journey, and in giving thanks to our many church leaders who are playing such a pivotal role in help to bring about the next chapter of ministry and faith here at NSCC.

Importance of the Present Moment

The calendar page has turned to September, our summer has passed, and new activities are underway.


Are we excited or wary? Likely a bit of both. New events bring questions and concerns: children are returning to school - some after long periods of virtual learning; high school grads are off to college, workers are finding out if their jobs will call them back to the office or allow work from home. Covid will continue its varied presence. Unpredictability and change often lead to stress.

There's help to allay anxiety and confusion. Give mindfulness a try. It's a brief but powerful call to calm the mind and to focus on the present moment at any given time. No specific skills or equipment is needed, except 5 or 10 minutes of your time, a quiet space, and comfortable seating. Close your eyes to avoid distraction; in some cases you may wish to have eyes open, especially in a nature setting.

Here's a technique using all senses; notice each for what they are at that moment; you may mentally describe them as you slowly inhale and exhale: - notice 5 things you can see; - notice 4 things you can hear; - notice 3 things you can smell; - notice 1 thing you can taste

Rev. Julie shares this "breath prayer": Choose a name for God/Jesus; focus on it as you inhale — and name a desire or "ask" for what you wish to receive as you exhale. Example: (Name) "Spirit of God"/ inhale; (Desire) "Breathe peace into me"/ exhale. Repeat a few times.

It is best to use a mind-centering exercise before you feel or take on a stressful situation. A helpful website with many topics on handling life situations is: www.npr.org/lifekit. It has options to listen or read, get newsletter or podcasts.
