


was surprised by many things that didn't happen, and others that did. I look towards the year to come and

As I look back upon 2022, I am surprised by so many things. I didn't expect our congregation to enter into a major time of transition as Julie accepted a new position (and I can tell you that she didn't expect to accept that new position). 
Tuesday Morning Book Group

Winter Farmers Market and Brunch – January 29, 11am

Local farmers, vendors and exhibitors, and fellowship with your church family...what could be better?

Mark January 29 on your calendars for our Food, Faith & Farming Network Winter Farmers Market and Brunch. The event is co-sponsored by Food, Faith & Farming Network, an ecumenical organization that works to foster urban and rural relationships and promote earth stewardship, community, spirituality and economic justice through healthy food and sustainable farming practices. Food will be sourced from local farmers.

The Food, Faith & Farming Network assists farmers across the state. Purchases from vendors not only support their livelihood, but also supports the Harvest of Hope Fund, a nonprofit providing emergency financial assistance for farmers. Vendors donate 10% of their sales if they make a minimum threshold of sales to the fund. Since the Harvest of Hope fund was initiated in 1986, it has given away over \$1 million dollars to farmers in need.

WINTER WALKING TIPS

Now that winter is here, it's a good idea to practice safe walking in the elements. Snow and ice can be a hazard for slips and falls that can lead to temporary embarrassment or the real possibility of a serious injury.

Here are just a few helpful tips to avoid dangerous falls:

- Assume all pavement and sidewalks, even cleared, will have slippery spots; use extra care on areas of pavement that appear wet or dark (black ice).
- Wear sturdy footwear with slip-resistant soles.
- Avoid carrying heavy items that can cause loss of balance; consider using a backpack to keep arms free (see below). Keep your phone tucked away while walking on slippery surfaces.
- Purchase and add ice tips to a cane or walking poles.
- ◆ Best of all, learn how to 'walk like a penguin': widen your stance, point your toes slightly outward for more stability, use your arms for balance, take small steps and walk slowly over slippery patches. (You can search 'walk like a penguin' videos on YouTube. I like the one by Alberta Health Services https://youtu.be/LHaWGibGwyk)


