"A Few Thoughts On...."

Forgiveness

In a recent confirmation session, we were exploring the ministry, death and resurrection of Jesus, and I asked the group what was accomplished on the cross. 'Forgiveness,' was the reply, 'We were forgiven for our sins.' 'Did it have to happen that way?' was my next inquiry. 'Did Jesus HAVE to die on the cross in order for us to be forgiven, or could an omniscient and omnipotent God have chosen another way to usher in our forgiveness?' There was some good discussion on this one, but the group did conclude that God could have chosen any of a plethora of ways to forgive us. It would, in fact, take nothing more than the snap of God's proverbial fingers to forgive all the errant ways of humanity. 'So,' I asked, 'if God could have done it another way, why did God choose this way?' Their response? Because, by doing it this way, we know it! God chose this path to salvation because God wanted us to understand the love and forgiveness that we know in Him.

I wonder sometimes, however, if we really do. There are few more powerful phrases that one can hear or proclaim than, 'I forgive you!' To know that we are forgiven by God and by others – and to share forth that forgiveness to those around us – carries a power and wonder that is almost unmatchable. And, God wants us to understand that! I wonder sometimes, however, if we really do.

Do we really think about what it means to say that we are forgiven in God? Do we really consider what it is that we are saying when we offer our forgiveness to another? There are some popular platitudes that reduce forgiveness

to a gift we give ourselves in not allowing the weight of another's offenses to remain a burden on our hearts. There is, I'd agree, some truth to that – but there is so much more to it. There is great risk, I think, in reducing forgiveness to an act of selfishness. There is great loss in seeing forgiveness as nothing more than allowing the misdeed of another to 'not bother me' anymore. There is so much more to this forgiveness that we know in God, and in this forgiveness that we are called to carry forth to others!

In forgiveness, there is love. In forgiveness, there is grace. In forgiveness, there is pardon, and judgment, and hope, and freedom! In forgiveness, there is so much more than a few words or the living out of some self-indulgent platitudes, and God wants us to understand that forgiveness! God wants us to know the depths of the forgiveness in which we stand, and the breadth of that which we are called to share!

So, that's what we're going to do this Lenten season. Beginning on February 26, and carrying through Holy Week, we will explore what it is to be forgiven and what it is to forgive, and I hope you'll be here to be a part of it all!




FORMATION AND ENRICHMENT




