I found myself sharing a conversation with our confirmands, at our final session just last week, about the distinction between 'graduation' and 'commencement' in our lives. There is, of course, an imperative connotation to the term 'commencement' that can sometimes be lost in our culture of celebrating graduation at each stage of life, and I'll leave it to you to consider what this distinction might have to do with confirmation (or join us on June 11 for Confirmation Sunday to hear more about it). For the purposes of this note, however, I want to talk about the seasonality of life, and where this very notion of commencement might play a role for each of us, today.

There is a clear and unmistakable shift that takes place at this time each year. For some, it is the annual transition from the more structured and hyper-calendared paradigm of the school-year to the more relaxed and flexible months of the summer. For some, it is shift into a season that provides some needed respite from the regular and consistent responsibilities we hold throughout the rest of the year. For some, it is a serenity that comes from the longer days and warmer temperatures that provide a little more light (both figuratively and literally) into each day. And certainly, for some, it is a time in which some major chapter of life is coming to a close and another is about to begin.

In the case of this last group, of course, the commencement that stands beyond their graduation is fairly clear. We have an entire two-page spread of these future plans for the graduates of our church family on pages 12 and 13 of this newsletter. And, more personally, you will find a church-wide invitation to Becca's graduation party (July 23) at the end of this message, as she, too, celebrates her graduation while looking with eagerness upon the commencement that stands before her. It is for the other groups, however, that I think the question of commencement perhaps doesn't get quite the attention it deserves.

#### Commencement continued...

I think it's pretty easy for us to look towards those major life events (graduations, empty-nest, retirement, etc.) and to see the commencement that is inherent within. The question of "what's next" flows naturally as we see these major chapters coming to a close and wonder what the next chapter will be. I wonder, however, how often we miss out on asking that question at the less obvious moments of life's journeys. How often do we see the budding trees and blooming flowers and ask ourselves what new life God is instill in us as we shift from one season to the next? How often do we look beyond the slower pace of the summer and see it not just as a respite from life's ever-growing demands, but as an opportunity for God to begin something anew in our lives? How often do see life's changing landscape, in which we are so often unwitting participants, as a potential launching pad for God's next commencement in our new days?

As a father going through this graduating-and-on-to-college thing for the first time, I can see so clearly the manner in which our life's major graduations lead so distinctly into the spirit of commencement – into the questions of what chapter is beginning as our past one is coming to a close. As I see this experience for our daughter, however, I do find myself wondering if we ask the question often enough, or if we might benefit from using all the changes of life – from the major graduations to the simple change of the seasons – to step back and ask ourselves what new beginnings God might be forming in, through, and for, us, today!



# The WCA Annual Meeting: The Church in Flight

In early May, I was our delegate to the Wisconsin Congregational Association's annual meeting and program held at the First Congregational Church of Wauwatosa. About 10 member churches were represented. Marty and six NSCC members were in attendance.

The theme was The Church in Flight. To me, this has a double meaning: It could be our church is "fleeing" for its life, or it could be our church is soaring to new heights. By the end of the program that morning, we were inspired to soar rather than flee.

Our presenter, Beth McCaw of the University of Dubuque Theological Seminary, likened the church's future course to a flight plan. We turned around to view the church behind us (i.e., the church of the past) and then looked forward to where our church might "land" in the future, taking into account various factors, including such societal trends as whether people currently identify with a denomination or attend any worship services. We also considered how we might, as part of our church's mission, make use of our church building and grounds in new ways to meet the needs of our neighbors in the wider community. It was certainly a very thought-provoking morning.

(I have to mention we were assigned tables according to the piece of candy we chose from a candy dish. It was an interesting way to meet Congregationalists from other churches, as long as you followed the rules and didn't try to scout out a table of people you already knew—say, it was the Strawberry Starburst table—and then chose your candy accordingly. I played my part fair and square.)

Moving on, the WCA's annual work includes: the Ministers' Fellowship, which consists of monthly meetings of member pastors for devotions and focused discussions; the WCA summer camp; and the next annual meeting. However, this year, the WCA has also assumed responsibility as host of the 69th Annual Meeting and Conference of the National Association of Congregational Christian Churches (NACCC). WCA member churches have been working hard to promote attendance and coordinate all the logistics. The NACCC's theme is The Daring Endeavor of Being Church, which will undoubtedly connect to and expand the discussion initiated by Beth McCaw's The Church in Flight presentation.

These NACCC events will be held Saturday, June 24 through Tuesday, June 27, at the Sheraton Milwaukee Brookfield Hotel and other local venues. I hope many of our churchgoers have registered for some of these opportunities, including free events all day on Sunday, June 25. As our delegate to the NACCC business meeting portion, I'm open to any comments, advice, or other input you might want to share with me.

# SAFETY UPDATE

New First Aid Kits have been placed to be more visible and accessible on each level of the building. It was determined that, due to a number of outside groups using the church, and having our own events, this was a need.

The kits are mounted on the wall near a fire extinguisher at the entrances to the kitchens in both Friendship Lounge on the first floor, and Fellowship Hall on the lower level. Another kit is located above the refrigerator in the library kitchen. A new kit was added to the second floor on the wall outside the youth room.

Consideration was given to these locations for accessibility during ongoing functions as well as availability to classrooms as may be needed.

Do you know there is an AED (portable defibrillator) on the premises? Would you know where to find it? It is located on the wall next to the elevator on the main level. Plans to offer a demonstration of use for staff and interested persons are in the works.

We are looking to hear from parents and guardians with input on how we can best serve our children and families during the summer months.


