The Wonderful "Next"

Many of you have had that experience of dropping your son or daughter off to college for the first time. Sharon and I hadn't reached that point of life, of course, until when we moved Becca into her dorm room at UW Madison just a few weeks ago. The move-in itself went very smoothly (kudos to UW Madison for the way they efficiently manage the move-in of some 8,000+ students each year!). Then we reached that critical point (those of you who have been through this know the point I'm talking about). I have since likened it to dropping your 3year-old at pre-school for the first time. No one was going to become 'ok' with what was happening. The sorrow wasn't going to suddenly wipe away. The tears weren't going to magically stop. There was nothing to do but 'rip off the band-aid,' walk out, and trust that the calm would come in time.

And, so we did! As we walked out the door, I watched the tears roll down Becca's face. I turned to see Sharon fighting back tears of her own. All the while, I struggled to stifle my own. My heart ached. There was, of course, my own sadness at play. Far more difficult, however, was the pain I knew that Becca was experiencing in this first goodbye. It ripped at my soul! I didn't want her to struggle. I didn't want her to cry. I didn't want her to hurt. I'm her dad – I wanted to fix her pain! I knew I couldn't... I knew I shouldn't... I knew I wouldn't... but boy did I want to! Sharon and I continued down the drive, waving back at Becca in the window as we staggered away. A few minutes later we were in the car and headed home.

There had been a few tears by now, and my heart was sore for sure, but the true flood of emotions didn't come until some 30-40 minutes later. As we continued the drive home, a text popped over the audio system of the car. It was from Becca. It was a text loaded with questions about a social opportunity she was going to attend the next day – about a series of events that she had looked up as a way to make connections and meet friends. It was text filled with

all of her plans of how she was going to first jump into this new reality that stood before her. As I listened to the words she had texted – it was then that the tears truly set in, but not for the reason I had long-expected them to come! The tears set in because she was making the turn. She was looking forward. She was finding her way. She was ok!

Was I still sad? Of course! Do we miss having her around the house? Absolutely! The emotions that flooded my heart as those words played, however, were not those of sadness, but of relief, of hope, and even joy. In just that short time, Becca's mind had turned from the sorrow of letting go of the chapter that was closing to the exploration and anticipation of the one that was just beginning. It wasn't that she'd never feel homesick again, nor that she was glad that we were gone. It was that she was turning her heart and mind away from what was to the possibilities of what could be. As a father, as much as I missed her (and still do), what greater joy could I have than to know that her heart was starting that process of embracing the wonderful 'next' that was unfolding before her.

In the weeks since, I couldn't help but think that our parent God must, so often, feel the same way. God doesn't want us to feel pain, but he knows that we will. God doesn't want us to know sorrow, but that is the reality of our living. What God wants most of all, however, is for us to look with anticipation and hope towards the wonderful 'next' that lies before us. In the realities of our lives, and even in the current life of our church, these truths are playing themselves out in some very palpable ways these days. My hope for all of us is that we might learn a bit from Becca's example, as we lean ever more into that wonderful 'next' that God has in store.



Tuesday Morning Book Group

We talk about so many things during the Tuesday Book Group gatherings, and recently, the topic of prayer has come up. How do we pray? Why do we pray? Are we praying in the right way? (Spoiler alert: there is no right way). With all this in mind, our next book is *Beginner's Grace by Kate Braestrup*.



Amazon offers this description,

"Prayer is an ancient and simple way to prepare yourself for grace, or love, and to learn to recognize it when it comes. Even the briefest "grace" spoken before dinner offers its time-honored wisdom. Yet, despite hundreds of traditions, teachings, and books about prayer, millions of Americans have become ambivalent about it. They are unsure how, when, where, and even why they might pray, afraid they'll do it wrong, or worried they won't be heard.

Writing in the beautiful, funny, honest narrative style that moved and inspired readers of her first book, Here If You Need Me, Kate Braestrup explains what prayer is and the many ways we can pray. With an approach that is both personal and inclusive, Beginner's Grace is a new kind of prayer book. Even if you don't pray and don't consider yourself religious, there's room in this book for you. In these pages, Braestrup explains how and why the practice of prayer can open a space in our busy lives for mindfulness, gratitude, contentment, and a wider compassion toward others.

Inspired by her work as a chaplain, Braestrup includes many examples of prayers to draw from—beginning with grace, a brief prayer of thanks. She provides clear models and practical suggestions for making your own and your family's prayers meaningful and satisfying, and offers prayers for situations in which words might fail: times of anxiety, helplessness, or grief. And she invites you to explore forms of prayer that extend into the wider community, including prayer with and for people we don't like or with whom we disagree."

Please join us as we explore prayer's role in our faith and how we can become more at ease incorporating prayer into our lives.

NEW SEASONAL VACCINES FOR RESPIRATORY HEALTH

There are three vaccines of importance this fall: the new Covid-19 vaccine; the annually updated Influenza vaccine; and the new RSV vaccine. These vaccines are developed to prevent severe disease and hospitalization and, in many cases, death.

- The annual Influenza vaccine is updated each year to match predominant viruses.
 There are different formulations, mainly the standard dose for many, and the high-dose quadrivalent formula for those over 65 years and others with certain chronic illnesses. It is important to get vaccinated by the end of October to obtain timely immune protection.
- 2. The Covid-19 vaccine is a new vaccine. It is designed to target a new sub-variant XBB. There are a few things to know about timing of getting this new vaccine, especially as Covid is already circulating: If you have had a recent infection it is best to wait 2-3 months after infection before receiving the vaccine. This ensures time for your own antibodies to build up. Ideally the longer the wait between infection or immunization the better, but that may not be feasible if a Covid wave is occurring. It is recommended for those age 65+ and others with chronic illness wait up to 4 months after their last vaccine or infection; younger healthy individuals can wait up to 6 months. Note: This year the vaccine is not free. It will be covered by Medicare and private insurance. You can receive both the Influenza and the Covid-19 shots at the same time, but it is recommended to get them in separate arms.
- 3. RSV vaccine is a new vaccine to prevent Respiratory Syncytial Virus, which predominantly affects infants under 12 months old. However RSV can be very serious in the elderly population, especially with additional diagnoses of asthma, COPD or CHF.

◆ Sunday, November 5 – Remembrance Sunday with a special musical presentation of John Rutter's Requiem throughout the service.




- ◆ Sunday, November 12 The second annual Harvest Fest hosted by our Fellowship Committee.


