The Confluence of the Christmas Calendar

Planning for the holiday season at NSCC for 2023 has been just a bit different than it is most years, and it all has to do with the calendar. Every five to six years (with periodic exceptions on leap years), we find ourselves coming back around to a confluence of holiday timing that makes for some distinct questions in the life of the church. With five Thursdays in November, Thanksgiving comes very early in the month this year. At the same time, with Christmas Eve falling on a Sunday, Advent starts very late (not until December 3). Thus, we find ourselves faced with a unique set of questions.

We don't often have a Sunday between Thanksgiving and the start of Advent, so we are posed with the question of what we will do with that 'in-between' time of worship when Thanksgiving is behind us, but the season of Advent has yet to begin. The timing of Christmas Eve falling on a Sunday is even less common, and it immediately forces the consideration of if and how that timing might impact our 'typical' Christmas Eve worship schedule. Do we have a service at 10am? Do we still have two services that night?

There are, of course, answers to these questions that you will find addressed throughout this newsletter (yes, we are having our 10am service on December 24 to recognize the fourth Sunday of Advent and we will have BOTH our 4p and 9p services later that day). What I want to leave with each of you as we head into this blessed Christmas season, however, is the gift that such a disruption of the norm can be!

There is something extraordinarily valuable about being pulled away from the common and expected and being forced to be thoughtful about how we will engage the season. As simple as it may seem, these uncommon circumstances of the 2023 season force us to be that much more intentional about the decisions we make and the paths that we take. What's done each year doesn't quite

fit. Last year's calendar doesn't quite match up. We don't have to throw the baby out with the bathwater, but we do need to pause for just a moment to give due consideration to how we will faithfully and meaningfully embrace the Christmas season that lies before us.

There is no doubt in my mind that the upcoming season will be filled with wonderful and treasured traditions that are part of your every year – I know that will be true for our family! I do wonder, however, if we all might benefit from the moment's pause that the calendar forced upon us as we headed into this year. Not a moment to question all we do or discard all we treasure, but a moment to consider how this season might look a bit different, and a moment to consider how we can most faithfully and meaningfully embrace both the treasured traditions and the delightful disruptions that this season... this story... this gift... can birth to our lives in 2023 and beyond.

Tuesday Morning Book Group



female ancestors and reflect on God's presence in their complicated lives, we can begin to release our expectations of a "perfect Christmas" and instead seek the experience of a holy season.



MODERATOR'S NOTE

As our church year enters the busy Christmas season, I would like to provide the congregation with updates on Midweek Manna, the 2024 budget and the 75th Anniversary Celebration.

Marty gave a wonderful explanation of the changes to **Midweek Manna** in his November newsletter article. I just want to remind everyone of the key changes that will begin in 2024. Starting in January, the service will be held on the third Wednesday of every month. There will always be a meal at 6:00 PM followed by the service at 6:45 PM. The theme of the service will be unique and not tied to the Sunday service in any way. Marty and the Diaconite Board will be providing more details in the coming weeks.

The **2024 budget** process began back in September when the boards submitted their proposed budgets to the Budget Committee. The Budget Committee reviewed the requests and created a proposed 2024 budget for the Council to review at the October meeting. After much discussion, the Council approved a proposed 2024 budget with a 2% increase over the 2023 budget.

Copies of the proposed 2024 budget will be available in the narthex on Sunday, December 3. Kerrin will be sending out an email on Monday, December 4 that will include the proposed 2024 budget. In addition, the Budget Committee will host a meeting on December 6 after Midweek Manna for members who might have questions on the proposed 2024 budget. A Zoom link will be provided for those who can't attend the meeting in person. The proposed 2024 budget will then be presented at the Congregational Meeting on December 17 and put to a vote for approval by the congregation.

A 75th Anniversary Celebration committee has been formed consisting of Marty, myself, Katherine Gregory, Sharon Hall, Ginny Kannenberg, Jeff Leypoldt, Amy Petersen and Becki & David Schimpf. All interested members are welcome to join the committee or provide information in the form of pictures, documents or memories regarding events in the history of the church. The committee looks forward to going back to the founding of the church in 1949 and taking the congregation on a 75 year journey that both honors our past members and inspires our current members.

Before NSCC, Elizabeth sang at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist, St. Paul's Episcopal Church, North Shore Presbyterian Church, and Plymouth Church. Elizabeth lives in Shorewood and spends a lot of time playing with their 20-month-old granddaughter. In addition to making and listening to music, Elizabeth enjoys hiking, cooking, baking, and movies.

Mezzo soprano Andrea Goetzinger began her singing career with The Bel Canto Chorus of Milwaukee. She has sung with numerous groups in the greater Milwaukee area. Andrea works independently as a Licensed Practical Nurse doing home care. She is also program assistant with the Bel Canto Senior Singers. Andrea lives in Wauwatosa.

Soprano Dr. Sarah Richardson is the voice instructor and Performance Coordinator at Alverno College. She is an active performer in the Milwaukee area and also enjoys presenting vocal workshops for area high school, community, and church choirs. Sarah holds a Doctor of Musical Arts degree from UW-Madison where she worked with baritone Paul Rowe and appeared in recitals, concerts, scenes, and full opera productions. Her dissertation project centered on the commission, premiere, and recording of a song cycle to honor her upbringing on a dairy farm and feed mill in north -central Wisconsin. As well, Sarah received her Master of Music degree from UW-Milwaukee and Bachelor of Music degree from Viterbo University. Sarah and Elizabeth Jonas are sharing the soprano section leader role this year.

Tenor Nicholas Lin is based out of the greater Chicago-land area, growing up Lincolnshire. He studied vocal performance in college. When not singing with the Florentine Opera Chorus or Milwaukee Symphony's Chorus, Nick works with a company called Peckham Media Productions which takes him to Chicago to produce

recordings and videos for individual artists, smaller artistic organizations like store-front opera companies, and institutions like Chicago Public Schools. In addition to videos and audio recordings, he has begun shooting professional headshots! Mr. Lin moved to Milwaukee in the summer of 2022 after his partner got hired by the Florentine Opera in their education department. Nick considers himself a mediocre piano player and spends his free time teaching himself the guitar, how to cook, and driving on I-94 to the next gig!

Colin Han, bass-baritone, is an active performer in the Milwaukee area, appearing as a featured soloist with the Sheboygan Symphony Orchestra and in local ensembles Chant Claire and Aperi Animam. Mr. Han was an apprentice artist with Milwaukee Opera Theatre for their 2019 production of La Clemenza di Tito. Additional operatic credits include Il Commendatore (Don Giovanni) and Dapertutto (Les Contes d'Hoffmann) in scenes with UWM Opera Theatre, and as an ensemble member in productions of Dido and Aeneas and La Périchole. He graduated in 2018 from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee with a B.S. in information science and technology along with a music minor. At UWM, Colin performed in numerous ensembles including Concert Chorale, Men's Chorus, and University Chorus. Colin has studied voice with Dr. David Hoffman and at the Madison Early Music Festival.


