

# The Close of Weekly Worship

Many of our church members had the opportunity, last winter, to attend the installation service for the Rev. Julie Sheridan-Smith, as she settled into her role as the Sr. Minister of our sister church in Wauwatosa. It was a joy and a privilege for us to be there on that snowy day. There was a moment of silent humor for me at the end of the service, however, that I have shared with a handful of you in recent months. At the close of the installation worship, Julie shared a benediction, and the organ began to play a postlude. Most of the attendees immediately began to mill about, visit with one another, and make there was to the fellowship hall for a reception. The 20 or so NSCC members, however, who were all seated in a group on one side the sanctuary, heard the first note from the organ and immediately sat right back down to listen. It was a remarkable display of unplanned synchronicity, as every NSCC member there followed that routine without missing a beat!

That is, of course, the longstanding practice here at NSCC. Without getting into the roots of the practice, it is something that goes back well over a decade in the life of our church. When the benediction is done, the postlude begins (typically on the organ), the congregation sits, and then, at the end of the postlude, we all clap in appreciation for the postlude that was shared. For some, it is a meaningful aspect of our weekly worship life. For others, however, it is not experienced in the same way. Which is the reason for this article as we head into 2024.

The question of how we currently close our worship service came to the attention of our Deacons when it arose in some of the listening sessions that were held regarding our search for a new Director of Music. Not wanting to leave the question lingering for the person who steps into that role sometime in 2024, the Deacons decided to tackle the question now and, starting in January, a new (and evolving) approach to concluding worship will take place.

It has long been stated in the order of worship that people are welcome to stay for the postlude, or depart the sanctuary, at their discretion. The end goal in the minds of the Deacons is to embrace this very concept. We want people who are served by listening to the postlude to be able to do so, but we also want those who wish to depart to feel free to do so without feeling compelled to sit and remain because that is the perceived expectation or routine of the congregation. To get this point of flexibility, however, we are going to make some temporary changes that might help to break away from current patterns and allow people to settle into new norms based on how they best experience the close of worship.

Beginning with worship on January 7, there will be a period of weeks in which there will be no postlude. In its place, the choir will return to the past practice of recessing during the final hymn, and there will be some sort of brief musical response to the benediction (choral or congregational) that will close the service. Note that the lack of a postlude is not expected to be a permanent change. The practice of sharing an organ postlude will be built back into the practice of worship in time, and the Deacons will be focused on when and how to best accomplish that goal. In the short term, however, it is our hope that this temporary shift in practice will allow some new norms to emerge, enabling us to embrace a more flexible pattern for our members in the future.

If you have any questions, you are welcome to speak to me or to any of our Deacons. For now, however, I simply ask that you be patient with the group as we work through this transitional period towards what we hope will be a more meaningful worship experience for all in the years to come.


### **Tuesday Morning Book Group**

Braestrup. We will begin our discussion on January 9

"Prayer is an ancient and simple way to prepare yourself for grace, or love, and to learn to recognize it when it comes. Even the briefest "grace" spoken before dinner offers its time-honored wisdom. Yet, despite hundreds of traditions, teachings, and books about prayer, millions of Americans have become ambivalent about it. They are unsure how, when, where, and even why they might pray, afraid they'll do it wrong, or worried they won't be heard.




Writing in the beautiful, funny, honest narrative style that moved and inspired readers of her first book, Here If You Need Me, Kate Braestrup explains what prayer is and the many ways we can pray. With an approach that is both personal and inclusive, Beginner's Grace is a new kind of prayer book. Even if you don't pray and don't consider yourself religious, there's room in this book for you. In these pages, Braestrup explains how and why the practice of prayer can open a space in our busy lives for mindfulness, gratitude, contentment, and a wider compassion toward others.

Inspired by her work as a chaplain, Braestrup includes many examples of prayers to draw from—beginning with grace, a brief prayer of thanks. She provides clear models and practical suggestions for making your own and your family's prayers meaningful and satisfying, and offers prayers for situations in which words might fail: times of anxiety, helplessness, or grief. And she invites you to explore forms of prayer that extend into the wider community, including prayer with and for people we don't like or with whom we disagree."




