

### "A Few Thoughts On...."

#### Sharing Your Story of the 75 Years of Ministry at NSCC

Did you know that our church started in a Fox Point living room and met for some 5 years at Country Day School in Whitefish Bay (what is now the Jewish Community Center on Santa Monica), before the first portion of our building was completed and dedicated in 1954?

Did you know that much of the stained glass in our building was designed and created by Charles Burroughs, a member of the church at the time? Did you know that the upper arch of the stained glass at the front of the sanctuary is actually a single piece consisting of three different 'windows' that slide along a rail and lock into place depending on the season (the star for Advent/ Christmas, the lamb at Easter and the white panels for the remainder of the year)?

I just learned, a few weeks ago, that the church sent a group of Pilgrim Fellowship (youth group) members on a three-week trip to England in the summer of 1969. One of our current members was on that trip as a sixteen-year-old and recounts it as a life-changing experience.

The stories and recollections that I've heard from long-time members of this church over the years have been a rich blessing to me, and have spoken deeply to the role this church has played in the lives of so many of our members in such a remarkable variety of ways. There is, however, so much more to be shared, and that is why the 75th Anniversary planning team is asking for your participation.

You will see, on page 11 of this newsletter, an announcement about a series of conversations being hosted by the planning team after worship each Sunday in January. The idea is simple – gather in small groups and share your stories about when/where/how this church has impacted your life. The goal is to gather these memories and stories, as a team, to help put a face on the ten pillars that we will be celebrating throughout 2024.\*\*

It is our hope that the conversations will be both informative to the team and enriching to all who share with one another. So, I encourage you to please see the sign-up sheets available in the main hall of the church and to take the time to be a part of one of these conversations throughout the course of February. In sharing our stories of what NSCC has meant to us in these last 75 years, we may just uncover some wisdom of what it can mean to others in the 75 years to come!



We continue to discuss our book Beginner's Grace by Kate Braestrup.



# PILLARS OF OUR CHURCH

# Happy 75th Anniversary North Shore Congregational Church!

Each month of this 75th year, a pillar of the church will be highlighted in order to celebrate the many different parts of our amazing church. This month is dedicated to the founding members of our house of worship.

In The Beginning...It is well documented that on the night of April 27, 1949, 25 persons gathered to pledge their support of a new Congregational Church to be started in the Fox Point area. At 8:00 p.m. in the evening, the group met at a home on North Lake Drive. They sung "Blest Be the Tie That Binds" and one by one they knelt at a small coffee table at the home of Fritz and Leanore vonGrossmann and affixed their signatures to the following statement:

"FOR THE GLORY OF GOD, FOR THE SERVICE OF OUR FELLOW MEN, AND FOR THE MUTUAL ASSISTANCE IN OUR CHRISTIAN LIFE, THE UNDERSIGNED AGREE TO BECOME MEMBERS OF A CONGREGATIONAL CHRISTIAN CHURCH."

The first service was held on May 15, 1949, at Country Day School. There were 92 people in attendance. When the Charter was closed on November 6, 1949, there were 329 members received. Of that group, 101 practiced their lifelong commitment to Christianity and God by maintaining an active membership. The average age of the members at this starting point was 32 years!

Online Giving is beneficial to our church, as it is a way of keeping our bank account current while saving the giver the hassle of having to write and mail a check. Giving directly through Realm, our cloud-based database and giving platform, also updates your record automatically, so you can see at a glance where you stand.

As the new year starts, it has become apparent that there is a little confusion regarding scheduling recurring payments. Below are instructions on how to make online gifts. Please note that, when setting up your EOG for the each coming year, you need to reschedule your recurring gift as well. If set up correctly, each year's giving will expire at the end of the year, allowing new giving to be set up for the year to come.

If you do not feel comfortable setting up online giving for yourself, or you need assistance in changing your giving patterns or amount, please contact Kerrin and she will be glad to assist.

#### Mention is made of the following:

- Kerrin cannot see your full account details, so your payment method remains secure once inputted.
- There is an option to add fees associated with your payment to the instructions. Please do not feel obligated to do so, but know that it does offset the fees the church needs to pay to accept online payments. If you do not add the fees, the full amount of the contribution will still be allocated to your account.

# Online Giving from Your Profile

Make a contribution from your Realm profile. You can contribute any amount using the button on your profile. If you want, you can set up recurring gifts or payments.

- ⇒ *Sign in* to your Realm account.
- ⇒ *Click Giving* in the main menu.
- ⇒ Click Give.
  - Enter the amount you want to give,
  - **Select the fund** by using the drop down menu to select the appropriate designation (for example EOG 2024 or Non-EOG). Fundraisers and memorials are available as selections as well. Use "Clearing Account" for items such as books or other miscellaneous payments.
  - If the fund has the memo field enabled, complete this field to add a note.
  - To give to more than one fund at once, click Another Fund (e.g. fees).


(**Optional:** If available, select Dedicate this gift in memory or in honor of someone.)

- Select a gift frequency.
- Give Once—Select a date to give a one-time gift.
- Give Multiple Times—Select a frequency by which your gift will recur. If you set up a recurring online gift, you will receive an email when the end date has been reached. For EOG giving, please set your end date to 12-31 so that it ends in the year you are giving for. You will need to reschedule your EOG recurring gift for the next year
- Click Continue.
- ⇒ *Enter your payment method*, or select one that you saved.
  - **Optional:** If you want to add a new payment method, select 'Enter a different payment method than one you already have.'
- ⇒ *Click Give.* A confirmation message displays.
- ⇒ If you want to turn your one-time gift into a scheduled gift, select the check box and a frequency for the gift. Otherwise, *click Finish*.

#### Note:

During months that have fewer than 31 days, recurring gifts scheduled for the 31st of each month will process on the last day of the month.


