#### "A Few Thoughts On...."

#### Moving Beyond the Routine of Prayer

We had a unique experience at our Midweek Manna gathering in July that I want to share with those of you who were unable to be here. In the midst of our busy summers, filled with blessings and challenges, we took some time at this monthly worship service to be intentionally and fully in prayer with God. To do so, however, we took a unique approach as we journeyed through 6 different 'prayer stations' that we had set up around the building.

There was the 'Entangled Hearts' station, in which people were encouraged to reflect on those priorities and motivations that so readily ensuare our hearts. After praying over these things, participants were encouraged to take a small heart from the net as a token of how God works to free our hearts from our worldly entanglements.

There was the 'Visual Prayer' station, in which people were encouraged to read a scripture passage and then draw a picture of the thoughts, questions and ideas that were raised by the passage.

There was the 'Prompted Prayer' station. Popsicle sticks with prayer topics were placed in a mug and participants were encouraged to take a few, randomly, as they focused a time of prayer on those particular people, situations, and needs listed on their sticks.

There was a 'Giving it Away' station, a 'Physical Prayer' station, and a 'Prayers of Praise' station. Each was different, and I am confident that some spoke more to some while others spoke more to others. The heart of the experience, however, was meant not only to get us into prayer, but to break us out of the routines of prayer that can sometimes limit our experience.

The truth is that, for many of us, prayer tends to follow certain patterns – be it intentional or subconscious. We pray at certain times of the day or at certain moments (before a meal, at bedtime, when we awaken, etc.) and/or we pray through a certain script, series of thoughts, or list of things each time. This is all well and good, and I am convinced that God is present in each and every one of those prayers, but I am also convinced that our prayer life is deepened when we push ourselves beyond the familiar routines and into new ways/manners/foci of our prayer life with God.

This experience that we shared at July's service was a blessing to me, and I am hoping that it was to others. It may also be something we repeat in some way or manner down the road. If we do, I hope you'll join us. In the meantime, however, I hope that we might all consider how readily we fall into that 'routine' of daily prayer and what we might do to expand that life of prayer from one day to the next. The impact it will have on our faith and relationship with God, I am convinced, will be well worth the venture into something new!


#### FORMATION AND FELLOWSHIP

## PILLAR 7 - MEMBERSHIP IN SERVICE 50+ YEARS

Our pillar for this month is dedicated to Membership in Service, 50+ years. Did you know that there are more than fifty people that have been active members of North Shore Congregational Church for fifty years or more?

A few reflections from this incredible group:

- Midge Croysdale: "Sometimes when you walk into a home when searching for a place to live, you feel right away that this is the one. That happened to my former husband and I when we first attended North Shore Congregational. It felt like home. I have loved our church and church family over all these years."
- Don Osborne: "I have been a member of our church for fifty nine years. My wife wanted a church where we could bring up our kids. She was a member for forty eight years before she died. We taught Sunday school for thirty five years. The reason that we stayed in our membership was because of the friendliness of the people."
- Sue Wood: "Bob Abendroth, a lawyer in Milwaukee, came to University of Michigan Law School to interview/recruit senior law students for his firm. Steve Wood was hired and thus we moved to Milwaukee after graduation in 1968. The Abendroths invited us to attend the church where they were very active members – North Shore Congregational – and introduced us to the minister, Dick Buchman. The rest is history..."
- Myla Hadcock: "We moved to MKE in 1970 after Walt's army stint and securing a job. Like others we visited different churches and came to NSCC on a Sunday Dick Buchman was preaching ... and kept returning. Everyone was very welcoming so we've stayed lo these many years. Not sure when we joined. Our two children enjoyed Sunday School, Walt taught 5th grade Sunday School, and I joined choir. Martha Circle and Scrooby soon followed. Back then parents signed up to "man" the Sunday School room so it was a natural way to meet other young families with and without children. Bottom line: we found our church home ... NSCC."

◆ Pat Debelak: The DeBelak family joined the church in 1966. At that time you had to attend four required sessions of a membership class. The various Boards presented at the sessions. "One of my Favorite Memories of this church was when we attended with our own little kids. Our son John was a trouble maker, yet he was always the first one dressed and ready to go to Sunday school. One day I asked him, "Why?" Little John said, "Because everyone there HAS to like me!" I made many close relationships here at North Shore and I'm thankful for those. I can remember someone that was getting dinners delivered during a life event and she jokingly said "If I get one more chicken casserole!" You see, when someone is in need in this congregation...there is always someone that will support you when you need it most."

On behalf of the entire North Shore Congregational Church community, we extend our deepest gratitude and heartfelt congratulations to each of you who have dedicated five decades of your lives to our church family. Your unwavering commitment, steadfast support, and profound faith have been the cornerstone of our congregation's strength and spirit. Your 50-year journey with us is a testament to your deep-rooted faith and your belief in the values that bind us together. 

#### PROTECTING HEARING IN A DEAFENING WORLD

Writer *David Owen*, in his book "*Volume Control - Hearing in a Deafening World*," explains how the loud noises we live with are harming our ears. Our ears are complicated and delicate structures that have not evolved to handle many of the current decibel levels in our modern environment. We assume that hearing loss happens to old people, but Owen says, "It is something that happens to old people - but it's caused by things we do when we are young." We're familiar with many typical loud noises: rock concerts, loud movies, fireworks, motorcycles, auto races, to name a few. I would add gas-powered lawn equipment and that extremely loud train horn at the zoo! (don't hang out around the crossings!)

However, even small household appliances such as food processors, coffee grinders (I cover mine with a tea cozy when using), vacuums, and hair dryers can generate noise levels that lead to permanent damage. Consider the speaker surrounds/settings in your TV watching area. Wearing ear buds consistently is definitely not a good idea. Especially caution your teens.



All this caution is important because noise damage is cumulative and irreversible, but it is preventable. The author strongly encourages carrying earplugs with you and not to be bashful about using them. This is the simplest thing you can do when anticipating an event such as going to a movie or any situation that will be loud, or to have on hand for a spur of the moment. (A description of various earplugs and effectiveness is included in the book).

Noise cancelling headphones are becoming more popular and an essential option. I've seen more children wearing them at fireworks and air shows. I took a photo of a sweetly sleeping infant on a blanket with a pair of them on his little head at last year's Blue Angels air show.. he's ahead of the game!
