PILLARS OF OUR CHURCH

PILLAR 8 - YOUTH

On May 15, 1949, during our first service at Country Day School, dozens of children and teenagers filled the congregation. We have pictures to prove it! Since that day, the youth have been a prominent and incredible part of our church's rich fabric for 75 years.

The foundation of our Youth is strong, committed and a source for our future. Over the years, we have nurtured waves of young people, providing them with a solid Congregational foundation. For example, on the second floor, outside the small chapel in the hallway, there are 18 framed confirmation group pictures circa 1988 and beyond. These pictures are a beacon of who we are, the commitment we give, and the support we honor in our Youth. I hope you can take a moment or two the next time you visit our meetinghouse to see these remarkable pictures, which are a part of our shared history.

Within the walls of our church over the past 75 years, our Youth have blossomed through many activities, including the Christmas Pageant, Confirmations, Advent Fest, Music & Movement and Godly Fun, KidsConnect, Vacation Bible School, Youth CF/PF and Lock-In's, to name a few. Each of these events has unique qualities that enrich and brighten the lives of our young members.

NSCC member and director of Children's Ministries, Kelsey Molinari shares these words, "The Children's Ministries at NSCC cater to the youngest in our congregation by distilling the lessons of the Bible and making them digestible and tangible while making the kids feel welcome into the community of faith in our congregation."

Outside the walls of our church over the past 75 years, our Youth have truly extended the right hand of fellowship and charity in remarkable ways. Our adventure trips have included Appalachian Work Camps, Mission Mazahua, Hosanna Mission, Habitat For Humanity, Congregational State Rallies, Green Lake Fall Retreats, Congregational Summer Camp, and two trips to Europe, to name a few.

NSCC member David Schimpf shared this touching story, "I was fortunate to serve on mission trips as a teen in Kentucky and Virginia. This experience of serving others and

sharing the love of God followed me into adulthood. As a parent I was blessed to participate on trips with all of my own kids. I became "Uncle Dave" to many of the youth one year and there were so many family members that one church member called it a "Schimpf family trip."

Looking back a few decades, we remember the ministers, staff and teams who influenced and shaped our Youth: Harry Clark, Karl Schimpf, Ralph & Carol DiBiasio-Snyder, Rob Fredrickson, Bill Schnell, Doug Gray, Sue LeFeber, Connie Mullins, Julie Sheridan-Smith, Kelsey Molinari, Marty Hall and the BCE & Children's Ministries.

Personally, my involvement with the Youth of this church struck a chord with me when I volunteered to be a Mentor. I have had this fortunate opportunity for three Confirmation classes over the last seven years. Each time, the spiritual journey taken by these young people was astonishing and distinctive. It also sparked something in me, prompting me to examine my own faith differently. I found myself, at times, taking the same learning path that these young people were advancing through. I look back and feel very blessed and fortunate to have had these three opportunities to watch our Youth on their religious passage as they discussed, questioned, and debated the Bible, Faith, and their relationship with God, and where this might take them in their spiritual growth journey.

During the month of September, the Friendship lounge will feature a variety of Youth inspired pictures, mementos and documents. These historical and important articles will narrate the long-standing story of how the Youth have moved through the church over the decades, growing, learning, and developing their faith in God. I hope each of you has a chance to visit this treasure trove of unique and timeless records that recognize a rich and wonderful story of our Youth and our church. Additionally, look to our TV monitors for more Youth-inspired subjects in September

The Youth of yesterday are our present, and the Youth of today are our foundation for tomorrow, bless North Shore Congregational Church!
