

Dear Friends,

It was a month or so ago that I was sharing a brief conversation with one of our staff members about the life of the church when they made the off-hand comment, 'This is a church that knows how to step up. That's something that is truly special about this place - people are always ready to jump in.' Then, just a few days ago after our Easter services, it was our oldest daughter who was asking me about some of what was going on in the life of the church and said, 'This church really knows how to rally when its needed.' I cannot express my gratitude for how true these statements are repeatedly proven to be!

To say that there is a lot going on in the life of the church at the moment is a gross understatement. That said, as ever, the church has rallied in extraordinary ways to continue the strength and vitality of our ministries in and through every moment of church life that we share together. I am deeply grateful for the extraordinary team of church leaders who have gathered to journey alongside through the challenges surrounding Kerrin's departure and the circumstances surrounding it. The faith, dedication and wisdom of that group (both individually and collectively) is a gift beyond measure (to both me, and to our church). I am comforted, each day, knowing that I have this team to lean on throughout it all.

And this, of course, is only the beginning. The number of people who jumped in to help support the office to keep our hours consistent throughout our transitions was stunning. I have been overwhelmed by the cadre of others who have offered special skills and background to help fill in the gaps. And not a day goes by in which people aren't checking in with me to see how they can be of assistance!

None of this, of course, is a surprise to me. I have come to know and anticipate the heart and nature of our church family and have seen this pattern repeat itself as we have come through one transition after another. I shared those two anecdotal conversations, however, because I want you all to understand that others see it too. Even those more on the periphery of our church see the distinctive and meaningful way in which the ministry is embraced by its members, and these past few weeks have brought that character to the forefront once again.

Many churches subscribe to that principal notion of the 'ministry of all believers.' What I have seen again and again is the manner in which our church lives it out in real and remarkable ways. For that faith, for that support, and for that commitment to God's purposes in and through the life of our church, I could not be more grateful! May God continue to guide that faith to new beginnings as the next chapter of our life unfolds.



HEALTH COMMITTEE

Spring is here! It lifts our spirits and offers us an array of opportunities to refresh ourselves, as well as our homes and gardens.

Foremost is enjoying getting outdoors and seeking the wonders of God's magnificent creation that surrounds us from our own yard to a nearby park or trail and beyond. It is known that



being amid nature, especially trees, has health benefits - find a place where you can walk and spend some time near trees. If you wish, take along a sketch book or journal. Breathe in the air, notice the textures of the bark, the leaf structures. What sounds do you hear?

Trees emit chemicals into they air to protect themselves from disease. These (phytoncides) have been linked to various health benefits in humans - when inhaled they can boost the immune system, reduce stress, stimulate mental focus and improve overall well-being. There is even research that has shown exposure to nature may decrease inflammation and faster recovery from surgery. (many hospitals have 'healing gardens' for example).

Investigate the Japanese practice of Forest Bathing (shinrin-yoku), a practice of connecting with nature to improve well-being. It is not a bath! It's not a hike, but a slow and intentional immersion of your senses in appreciating the physical aspects of the surroundings. A class is offered at Schlitz Audubon Nature Center or you can access one online.

June 23-27, 2025 (9am-12pm daily)


