

Dear Friends,

It was October 10, three weeks before Halloween, that Sharon and I were out getting supplies for the October 12 Harvest Fest here at NSCC. As we walked through the back aisles of Meijer in Grafton we encountered the usual holiday section filled with décor and trinkets for the upcoming Halloween festivities. Then I turned around and, sure enough, there was an entire aisle filled with - you guessed it - Christmas lights! On October 10... still 76 days out from Christmas... it was already on the store shelves.

Most of you know that I like Christmas, and all of it's trappings and décor, as much as the next guy (perhaps even more than many), and Christmas arriving at stores earlier and earlier is nothing new or noteworthy. That said, as we climb around our jack-o-lanterns to string our Christmas lights, it's worth a momentary pause to remember that there's another holiday in that mix that deserves a reasonable bit of our attention.

After the kids are done counting their candy from the Halloween haul, and before they start counting the presents under the tree, it is right that we all stop for a moment to count the innumerable blessings that we know in life. It is not that we pretend that life is perfect - nor ignore the trials of the moment that very well might be our reality - but it is right that we stop to remember God's gifts and providence that abound in every day and take a moment to look towards the source of the blessings that we know in life.

At our house, the Halloween décor is up and around both inside and out. And, yes, it is highly likely that we will work to get our outside Christmas décor up and set before Thanksgiving, so as to beat the colder weather that is yet to come (we won't turn on the lights - but they'll be up there!). Still, as Thanksgiving week comes, we will pause long enough to take stock in our gratitude. We will be here for Thanksgiving worship on November 23 to rejoice in God's gifts, we will gather with family on Thanksgiving Day and go around the table with our statements of gratitude, and we will be thoughtful about all of the blessings we so often overlook.

For sure, when Thursday turns to Friday, the bins will emerge from the basement, the Christmas décor will fill the house, and those ready-to-go lights and decorations will be turned on outside. Before we jump from Halloween to Christmas, however, we will find our ways to stop and give thanks for the wonders we know (and so often overlook) from day to day, and I pray that you will find your ways to do the same.

Enjoying Holiday Eats and Treats Without Guilt

The temperature is dropping, the sun is setting sooner and joyful holidays are upon us. We look forward to a plethora of gatherings large and small.

What is the common element we all share when we gather, aside from the fellowship of friends and family? It's food of course!

Here are a few ways to approach the holiday tables more mindfully so you can enjoy your favorites and come away without guilt and extra pounds:

- Don't arrive to the party hungry. A good hint is to have a pre-party snack before setting out consisting of a protein and complex carb, such as a few apple slices and peanut butter or similar combo. This will guide you to the next step:
- Buffet savvy. Wander around the table and assess what is being served. Check out the options and select 2 or 3 favorites and balance with some healthier choices. Be aware of how much is on your plate and do not stand next to the buffet table!
- Bring a dish to share that you have made yourself that you know is healthful but is also amazingly delicious.
- Enjoy your favorites. Spend calories judiciously on the foods you absolutely love. It's ok to indulge occasionally at special times that are meaningful and shared.
- Eat slowly savor each bite. Engaging in light conversation with those around you can also help in this regard.
- Limit sugar-sweetened beverages and alcohol. A trend toward non-alcoholic

 glass of water or other non-alcoholic beverage (be aware there are many
 seltzers and other drinks that are "hard", which contain alcohol. Some are also
 caffeinated).

• Pay attention to what really matters. Put the focus on your family, friends and conversation.


